IN FOCUS

MOTHERWELL

Two 2-0 defeats from Rangers in the League Cup section at the start of the season have not in the slightest daunted Motherwell. They are still hopeful of pulling off a win, or at least a draw, at Ibrox today. And those earlier results won't put any false notions into the minds of the Ibrox players—they will still be expecting it tough.

Especially as 'Well now have their ace striker Dixie Deans back on duty after missing the two earlier matches because of suspension, and brilliant young international goalkeeper Keith MacRae in action after a wrist injury.

Motherwell are only a point behind Rangers in the table, having won three and lost two of their five League matches so far. But the Fir Park side always respond to the big-crowd atmosphere at Ibrox . . . especially the ex-Rangers' men Bobby Watson and Brian Heron.

Brian, used as both a left-back and outside-left in his days at Ibrox, has settled to a permanent attack place and is indeed the top scorer at Fir Park with five to his credit.

KEITH MACRAE. Just 20, but this six-foot red-haired goalkeeper is already acknowledged as one of the best in Scotland. A trainee newspaper reporter, he is also a versatile outfield player and has scored some good goals in his time for 'Well. However, he has now settled to be a 'keeper only . . . and won a Scottish League cap against the English last season. Has now fully recovered from a hand injury. Born in Carnwath, Lanarkshire and signed from Lanark Grammar, he is a former Youth internationalist.

DAVIE WHITEFORD. Hard-tackling, athletic full-back who was shaken off a back injury which kept him out for most of last season. Davie, a full-timer, is 24 and is a fine volley ball player.

JOE WARK. A 22-year-old who lives in Govan, left-back Wark was signed from junior side Irvine Vics in 1967. A great favourite with the Fir Park fans because of his fine ball control which can ease him out of what seems a dangerous situation. Versatile, too, once moved up into the attack when Motherwell were 1-0 down to Montrose with 20 minutes to go—and hit a hat-trick.

TOMMY FORSYTH. Only part-timer in 'Well's first team squad, but you would never know it. Tops the 6 ft. mark, and was a Motherwell fan when signed from Stonehouse (as an inside-forward) three years ago. A joiner to trade—and a great defensive-cum-attacking wing-half.

WILLIE McCALLUM. Tall centre-half who has been with Motherwell for 11 years, signing up from Douglas Water Thistle. An ex-Dalziel High School player he was a wing-half for many years but then took over the pivot spot and made it his own. Slim, but tackles hard.

BOBBY WATSON. 23-year-old ex-Ranger who joined the club in April and quickly established himself as such a top-class man that he was appointed captain. Powerhouse in midfield, and a formidable opponent when it comes to a tackle. Bobby is a quantity surveyor and lives in Airdrie.

BILLY CAMPBELL. Slim little Irish international winger with a devastating turn of speed. 25-year-old

Billy joined up at Fir Park earlier this season in an exchange deal which took Jimmy Wilson to Dundee.

JIM MUIR. 'Jumbo' to the Fir Park fans, who find him a frustrating character. Opponents find him that too—and dangerous as well. Signed the same week as Joe Wark from the same junior club, Irvine Vics. Is 22, an ex-foundry worker now full-time and lives in Kilwinning. Looks awkward—but is hard to handle, as far as defenders are concerned.

JOHN GOLDTHORP. Has finally broken clear of a long injury spell and his classy play in midfield has established him as a key man for 'Well. Now a full-timer after giving up engineering apprenticeship.

BRIAN HERON. Joined 'Well at the same time as Bobby Watson in the Peter McCloy deal. Former Baillieston Junior, Brian operated at left-back for Rangers in a few games last season—including European ties. 22-year-old.

TOM DONNELLY. Another ex-Ranger who went to 'Well three seasons ago after being released from Ibrox. Midfield man with a nice passing touch, he scored a fine goal against Rangers in the 2-2 draw at Fir Park last season. 23, and a University student.

DANGER MAN



DIXIE DEANS

Real name is John—but was nicknamed 'Dixie' by the fans when he was a prolific goalscorer with Neilston Juniors. Motherwell signed him five seasons ago, and he has kept up the scoring rate, figuring prominently in the goal charts every season. Holds the Fir Park post war scoring record of 32. Only 5 ft. 8 in., and stockily built, but he is very good in the air and packs a good shot in both feet. Dixie lives in Paisley, is married with a son. Missed the start of the season because of suspension and is only now reaching peak fitness.

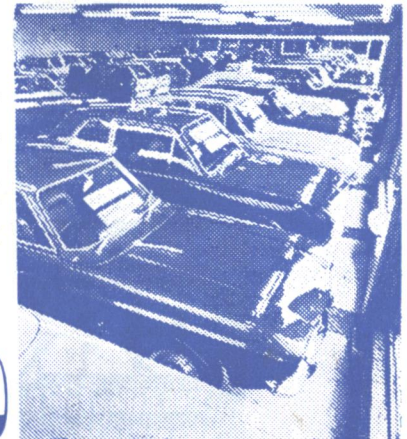
