IN FOCUS

DUNDEE

Dundee's surprise home defeat by Clyde at Dens Park last week brought to an end a run of success which had taken the Taysiders through seven games without defeat.

So it can be certain that John Prentice's team will be aiming to get back on the winning way today. They are currently in joint seventh place in the table with 15 points — three less than Rangers.

The Dens Parkers have always had a reputation for being a top-class footballing side, with the emphasis on smooth soccer. Under John Prentice, a former Rangers player, they are maintaining that image.

Manager Prentice is a great believer in modern, progressive football based on possession. He had success with Arbroath, Clyde and Falkirk using this method and was for a short time Scotland's international team boss.

Now he is in the process of rebuilding the Dundee team, and has changed the shape of the side considerably in the last few seasons.

For a time Dundee were recognised as a bogy team for Rangers. Indeed, between 1957 and 1963 they visited Ibrox six times and never lost, winning four games and drawing three.

Last season Rangers won 3-1 at Ibrox but went down by 2-1 at Dens Park.

Dundee have won both the Scottish League and Scottish Cup once — taking the flag in 1961-62 and recording their only Cup success at Ibrox in 1910 when they beat Clyde after two drawn matches.

The Dundee team will come from the following pool of players

ALISTAIR DONALDSON. One of the most reliable goalkeepers in the country — a quality which has earned him Scottish League honours. Tops the 6ft mark. Joined Dundee from Tyne-castle Athletic in 1961 and has been a first-team regular for many seasons.

BOBBY WILSON. A very speedy, quick-tackling full back who was signed from Cowdenbeath in 1966. One of the modern attacking backs who likes to come through on the over-lap.

DAVE SOUTAR. A versatile player who has been with manager Prentice at Arbroath, Clyde and now Dens Park.

JIM STEELE. One of the most promising young players in the country. A big fellow, too, standing over 6ft and weighing in at around 12½ stone. Normally a midfield man, but is good enough to be used in any position.

IAN PHILLIP. A young player who has broken through to the Dens first team to fill the problem centre half spot in preference to experienced men like Doug Easton and George Stewart.

DOUG HOUSTON. A long service player who joined Dundee from Queen's Park after a successful amateur international career.

JIMMY WILSON. A skilful, dangerous winger who has given great service to Newcastle, Morton, Aberdeen before linking up with Dundee this season. Small, but speedy and very tricky.

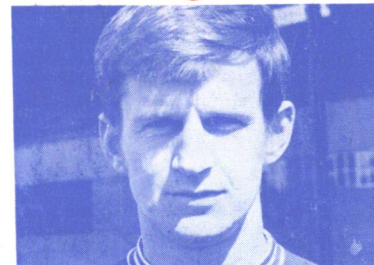
ALEX KINNINMONTH. Dens Park handy-man who has turned out in most positions since he signed for the club from Blairgowrie juniors is the club's longest-serving player, having been with them since 1960.

JOHN SCOTT. A very dangerous, sharp-shooting opponent who has scored a lot of fine goals for Dundee since he joined them in 1964 after a spell with Chelsea. Short, stocky and speedy.

DAVE JOHNSTONE. A big, powerful fellow who had to wait three years for his breakthrough at Dens after signing from Banks O' Dee the Aberdeen junior club.

RON SELWAY. Another big strapping fellow, standing around 6ft and weighing more than 12 stone. Plays anywhere in the defence.

GORDON WALLACE

Gordon is Dundee's leading scorer so far this season with 12 goals — which puts him one ahead of John Scott. This is no surprise to anyone, for the smallish, slender Wallace has been a prolific scorer throughout his senior career which started with Montrose. He then moved to Raith Rovers where he was the top marksman in Scotland a few seasons ago and was named Scotland's Player of the Year.
