

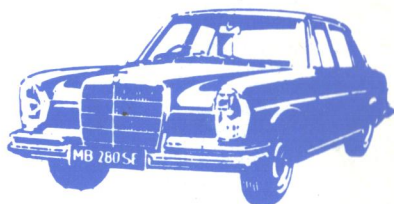

# IN FOCUS

## DUNFERMLINE

This is the fourth meeting between Rangers and Dunfermline this term — they were paired in the same League Cup section — and it's certainly a vital game for the Fifers, who find themselves in the unusual position this season of having to fight for every point to stay clear of relegation.

### VISITING CAPTAIN



JOHN CUSHLEY

Big John Cushley was bought by Dunfermline from English club West Ham this season to help strengthen the Fife defence — and he has done that very effectively. Ex-Celt Cushley, a rugged, powerful defender, is also an M.A. graduate of Glasgow University and is an expert linguist.

For the past 10 years, Dunfermline have been one of Scotland's most progressive sides, landing the Scottish Cup twice and earning a lot of praise for their performances in European competition.

So it is understandable that the Fifers are not taking kindly to their current predicament. But, under manager Alex Wright, who was appointed a few months ago, they are making a brave effort to get clear of trouble. They will make it difficult for Rangers today.

But that wasn't quite the case when the clubs met in the League Cup at the start of the season. Rangers trounced the Fifers 4-1 at Ibrox in the opening game of the season and went even better in the second game at East End Park . . . running up a 6-0 victory.

Remarkably, Rangers have a record of big wins over the Fifers. They once beat them 8-1, have scored 7-1 victories twice and also hit six against them on three other occasions apart from this season.

However, in recent years it has usually been a close contest — indeed, when the clubs met in the League at East End Park on November 7 the game ended in a 1-1 draw.

The Fife team will come from the following pool: Goalkeeper Ernie McGarr. The tall keeper was signed from Aberdeen just a couple of months ago.

Full-back Willie Callaghan. This hard-tackling little defender has been with the Fifers since 1960, signing from Fife junior club Crossgates Primrose.

Versatile defender Jim Thomson has been at East End Park for 10 years, joining from St. Mirren in 1961.

Left back John Lunn. Another long-serving Fifer, he was bought from junior club Blairhall Colliery in 1961. Very fast and a hard tackler.

Right half Jim Fraser. A big, powerful defender who has had some bad injury luck in recent seasons. Fully recovered now from a leg break. Signed from juvenile side Novar Star in 1962.

Left half Billy McLaren. This tall former Kirkintilloch Rob Roy player can be used in either attack or defence. Thoughtful player, with a deceptively long stride.

Outside right Alex Edwards. 'Mickey' has been a Fife player for 10 years, joining from schools football. A very tricky, skilful player with a great eye for an opening he can be an orthodox winger . . . or a deep-lying midfielded general.

Inside forward Barry Mitchell. It cost Dunfermline £15,000 to sign the tall, fair-haired Mitchell from Arbroath in 1967. A strong-running type who can ruffle defences.

Inside left Pat Gardner. A £20,000 buy from Raith Rovers in 1967, the hard-working, hard-shooting Gardner has scored many vital goals for Dunfermline.

Outside left Hugh Robertson. Has been six years with Dunfermline after a long career with Dundee.

## DANGER MAN



JOE McBRIDE

Scoring goals has been Joe McBride's job with EIGHT senior clubs. And it's a job jaunty Joe tackles with relish. Dunfermline bought him from Hibs a few months ago and already he has netted many vital goals for the Fifers. Joe started his career with Kilmarnock . . . then came Wolves, Luton, Partick Thistle, Motherwell and Celtic. Combines football with a flourishing business in Glasgow and the West of Scotland.

## CLUB CREST

No. 8 Dunfermline



Founded in 1885 when local cricketers decided to go in for a new sport, Dunfermline really came into their own during the 1960's. They won the Scottish Cup in 1961 and 1968 and performed notably in European competitions. They were also beaten Cup finalists in 1965. Other honours — Division Two champions in 1925-26; runners-up League Cup 1949-50.

# FOR SAFETY'S SAKE

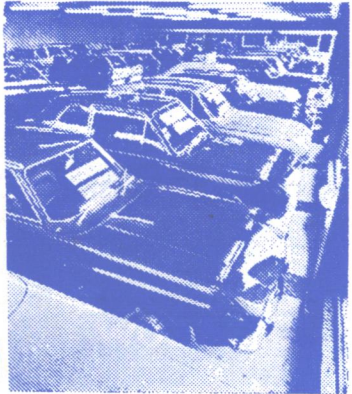

# Jubilant Jackson Sweeps Rangers into the Cup Semi's...

Colin Jackson's fourth goal of the season for Rangers was by far the most vital . . . a winner which takes the Light Blues through to a Hampden date with Hibs in the Scottish Cup semi-finals on March 31. Here, in three stages, the camera captures the drama as the Ibrox sweeper comes up to join the attack to get the only goal of the game.

1. Jackson follows up, after two earlier attempts have been blocked, to head past the diving Bobby Clark.
2. The jubilant Ibrox player . . . he comes from Aberdeen . . . signals his joy.
3. The scene of desolation in the Dons goalmouth in the aftermath of the goal. Keeper Clark sits dejectedly on the ball, while colleague Henning Boel holds his head in dismay.

# RESERVE REVIEW

A fine hat-trick from outside left Billy Semple helped the Ibrox Reserves to a fighting 4-3 win over Airdrie at Broomfield last Saturday.

This treble lifts Billy's tally to the season for eight . . . which leaves him nine behind Second Team top scorer Derek Parlane, who grabbed the other goal at Broomfield to raise his total to 17.

Coach Stan Anderson was pleased at the win, and delighted with Semple's three-goal display.

"Billy played really well, apart from his goals. He was a very powerful winger — a real raider" says Stan.

"I think the whole team is beginning to recapture form again, but there is still a bit to go".

Semple shot the Reserves into the lead with an early penalty, but then slackness in defence let Airdrie in for two first-half goals to give the home side a 2-1 interval lead.

But in the second half, Rangers got going again and a double from Semple and a brilliant goal from Parlane took them to four before Airdrie got their third in the closing seconds from the penalty spot.

"Parlane's goal was a cracker" says coach Anderson. "He took a through pass and beat three men, including the keeper, before scoring".

The Ibrox team was R. Watson; Miller, Alexander; K. Watson, McCallum, Morrison; Pirrie, Penman, Walker, Parlane, Semple.

Young George Donaldson came on as substitute for Neil Pirrie about 20 minutes from the end.

There is still no sign yet of dates for Rangers Reserve League Cup final against Celtic, or their semi-final tie in the

Second Eleven Cup. Both will probably come towards the end of this month or in early April.
