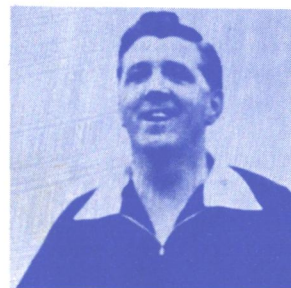

# IN FOCUS

## AYR UNITED

A run of fine results in recent matches has lifted the talented Ayr United team away from the foot of the table into a position more in keeping with their undoubted ability.

Managed for the past five seasons by Ally McLeod, who is as much of a character as a manager as he was as a player with Third Lanark, St. Mirren, Blackburn and Hibs, Ayr have slowly emerged as team with a good balance of skill and strength.

### VISITING CAPTAIN



STAN QUINN

Chunky Stan Quinn is the ideal type of skipper — a dedicated, enthusiastic player who gives everything for his team. Stan, from Glasgow and an engineer, was signed from Shettleston Juniors five years ago. Not big — but hard to beat.

And the Somerset side have shown that they are willing to spend money to get the kind of team they think will take Ayr to the top . . . manager McLeod has already bought ex-Ranger George McLean from Dunfermline this season.

Phil McGovern from Newcastle United and Alex Ingram from Notts Forest at a total cost of something in the region of £50,000.

The Ayr side come to Ibrox today with the encouraging knowledge that they have already beaten Rangers this term — 2-1 at Somerset in the League on November 21. That was a score they had achieved in the corresponding League match last season as well.

But their record at Ibrox is vastly different. Indeed, in 27 visits since 1913-14, they have won only twice — scoring a 3-1 win in 1914-15 then having to wait until 1959-60 before they were victorious again, this time by 3-0.

Rangers have inflicted some crushing defeats on the Somerset side over the years . . . with a 9-0 victory in 1929-30, a 9-1 win in 1933-34 and a 7-3 triumph in 1960-61. There has been another seven-goal showing by the Light Blues plus three six-goal performances.

Altogether, the clubs have met 55 times in the League, with the record reading: 36 wins to Rangers, nine to Ayr and 10 drawn.

The Ayr team will come from the following pool: Goalkeeper **Davie Stewart** is an Under-23 internationalist, who has attracted the attention of a number of bigger clubs. Wants full time football.

Right back **Jim McFadzean**. School

teacher **Jim** started his career with Raith Rovers and had spells with Hearts and Kilmarnock. Likes to come up in attack.

Left back **John Murphy** is an Ayrshire man and works with a big manufacturing concern in Kilmarnock. Has been eight years at Somerset, signing from Darvel Juniors.

Right half **Rikki Fleming** is a former Rangers player. Currently on the open to transfer list at his own request.

Left half **Doug Mitchell** is a local man. 23 years old, and works in a Kilmarnock distillery. Formerly on Leeds groundstaff, he's a clever forceful wing-half.

Outside right **Quinton Young**. A former Junior cap with Kello Rovers, the speedy Young has won a place in Scotland's Under-23 side this season.

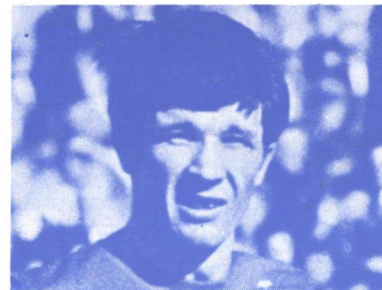
Inside forward **Phil McGovern**. Bought from Newcastle United a couple of months ago for around £16,000.

Inside forward **Davie McCulloch**. Ex-Kilsyth Ranger. They say when he's playing well . . . so are Ayr.

Outside left **Bobby Rough**. A real flyer, Bobby has just made a return to the first team after a long time out because of a knee injury.

**John Doyle** is one of Ayr's up and coming young men, signed from juvenile football last year.

## DANGER MAN

Ayr spent about £20,000 to bring Alex Ingram back from Notts Forest, the club he joined from Somerset 18 months previously. And it has been money well spent. The forceful Ingram, capped at schools, Amateur and Scottish League level, has provided plenty of drive for the Ayr attack. Particularly good in the air. Learning the garage business right now.

## CLUB CREST

No. 9 AYR UNITED



The club was formed in 1910 when Ayr and Ayr Park-house joined together after long negotiations. In 1912 and 1913 they won the Second Division championship — a feat they have achieved six times, which is a record. They have never won the First Division championship (highest place was fourth in 1915) and not been Cup or League Cup winners. In 1928 Ayr player Jimmy Smith banged in 66 League goals, which is still a British record. Somerset Park was bought in 1920 for £2,500.

# WEMBLEY TICKET BALLOT

Because of the tremendous growth in numbers of Rangers members and season ticket holders, it has become impossible for the club to supply everyone with a ticket for the England-Scotland match at Wembley. Accordingly, in fairness to all, a ballot will be held. Just behind the turnstiles at the entrances for season ticket holders, gaily-coloured boxes have been placed. Members and season ticket holders should tear ticket No. 13 from their book, and place it in one of these boxes, which will be in position for today's match, and the home First team game against Morton next week. Successful Candidates will be notified by Post no later than April 10. If you have not heard by then, you have unfortunately failed to get a ticket. No postal or telephone entries can be accepted for the ballot, which the club feel is the fairest method of deciding the Wembley allocation.

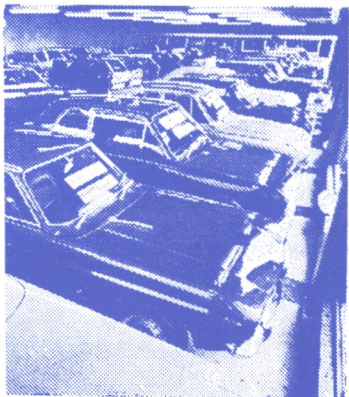

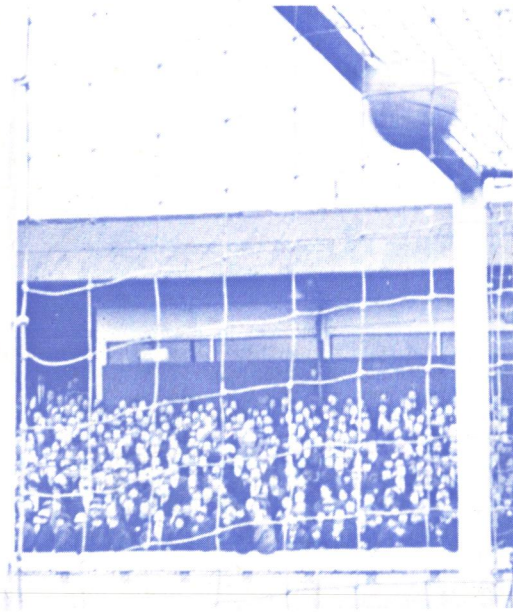

# CUP FACT-FILE

Next Wednesday at Hampden Rangers and Hibs meet in the Scottish Cup semi-final . . . the fifth time the clubs have clashed at this stage of the competition.

\* \* \*

Each team has scored two semi victories.

\* \* \*

The last time they met in a semi-final was at Hampden in 1957-58 when after a 2-2 draw, Hibs got through 2-1 in the replay. This was the game where Rangers centre Max Murray scored what looked like a late equaliser . . . but after giving the score, referee Bobby Davidson consulted a flag-waving linesman, then disallowed the goal for an infringement.

\* \* \*

Altogether there have been 15 Cup-clashes between the clubs . . . and Hibs have the edge. They have won eight to Rangers' seven. So Wednesday is a chance for the Ibrox men to level the score.

This is the third season in succession the clubs have met in the Cup. In 1969 and 1970 they clashed in the first round — both times at Ibrox — and Rangers won 1-0 and 3-1.

His next game was against Clyde at Ibrox last Saturday. Rangers were trailing 1-0 when George was brought on as substitute for Derek Parlane in the second half . . . and young George promptly cracked in a double to give the Ibrox colts a 2-1 win.

Then on Monday night of this week George hit another two goals in the 2-2 draw against Dundee at Dens Park.

Quite a come back for the young player, and Reserve coach Stan Anderson is delighted.

"George is a really hard worker and a player of great promise" says Stan. "He certainly helped the team get the goals in these games".

Unfortunately, George was missing when the Ibrox reserves disappointingly went down 1-0 to Falkirk at Brockville in the semi-final of the Second Eleven Cup.

"We made plenty of chances and failed to take them - Falkirk took the one that came their way, and that was it" says coach Anderson.
