## 70 LEAN YEARS DON'T WORRY HAPPY 'MUIR

**"We must be one of the richest clubs in Scotland". That's hardly the kind of statement you would expect to be applied to little Stenhousemuir.**

And although secretary Jim Weir is undoubtedly a bit tongue-in-cheek about the statement, he is quick to explain why he makes it.

"Stenhousemuir have no real money in the bank but have no debts either." He points out:

"We are not like so many other clubs who set out with the best intentions, to build new stands and pay big wages, but are now finding out they just cannot afford it.

"We are a happy club, a community team, and happy with a little success now and then".

Success, of course, is relative, for 'Muir have done nothing to get themselves into the record books since they were founded back in 1884, playing in Cup tournaments in the Falkirk area.

They became members of the Second Division when it was founded in 1921 and have been in that League ever since — BUT THEY ARE A HAPPY CLUB, AS JIM WEIR EMPHASISES.

"Everyone in Stenhousemuir takes an interest in what is happening at

Ochilview", says Jim, who has been a committee member since 1946 and club secretary for the past 22 years. He goes on:

"The club is run by a committee of nine. We have never been used to big attendances, so the current slump in interest has not affected us the way it has other clubs.

"We run with a pool of 15 players, which can be very tight at times, especially if you pick up a couple of injuries. But we feel this is the best way:

"When we try to sign a player, we tell him we can't offer much money. BUT WE CAN OFFER HIM THE CHANCE OF A GAME NEARLY EVERY WEEK. Many join us for that reason.

"I think most would agree they get a fair deal".

Like most Second Division clubs, 'Muir have helped launch a few famous players on their way to stardom. Former Celtic and Scotland forward Willie Wallace, now with Crystal Palace, started his career at Ochilview as did Willie Ormond, who went on to become one of Hibs' 'famous five' forward line.

Tonight's game will be the tenth clash between the clubs all in Cup-ties, of course. 'Muir have never managed even a draw in the previous nine games, which date back to a Scottish Cup

*semi-final meeting in 1902-3, which Rangers won 4-1. Indeed, in the previous nine games Rangers have scored 31 goals and conceded 5.*

### THE PLAYERS

The 'Muir team will come from the following pool:

Goalkeeper **Stewart Kennedy**. Tops the 6ft mark and has been attracting attention of bigger clubs this season. This is his second spell in senior football. He was with Dunfermline as a 17-year-old, but was released and went back into junior football with Linlithgow Rose before signing for 'Muir 18 months ago. A mining engineer from Kincardine.

Full-back **Billy Henderson**. Former St. Mirren and Motherwell man, he is a P.T. teacher in Wishaw, his home town. First attracted 'Muir when he trained with them while attending a college for Boys' Brigade officers at Stenhousemuir. When he was freed from Paisley, they signed him last season.

Full-back **Archie Rose**. Tough, hard-tackling defender who was signed from famous juvenile side Campsie Black Watch three years ago. An engineer in Glasgow.

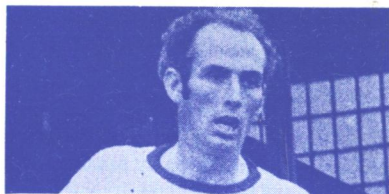
Wing-half **Billy Murdoch**. Brother of Celtic's Bobby and a former Parkhead player himself. Went south after being freed by Celts and had a season with Bristol City before returning to Scotland to join 'Muir two seasons ago. A glazier by trade, he comes from Rutherglen.

Defender **Kenny Muir**. Joined the club only this season from Clackmannan Juniors. This big, strong teenager is a civil servant in Stirling.

Defender **Harry Glasgow**. Vastly experienced man who has lined up against Rangers many times for previous clubs Falkirk and Clyde. Tall, skilful player who is powerful in the air and likes to join in attacks. An engineer at an oil refinery in Grangemouth, he is the 'Muir skipper and rated the ideal captain.

Defender **Russell Halliday**. Recent signing, he can play in midfield as well. Freed by Albion Rovers at the end of last season. A plumber in Whitburn.

Defender **John Jamieson**. Lasted only nine minutes of the game in the first leg at Ochilview before going off

injured. Big, powerful, fellow, he was signed from his home town club Armadale but has had previous senior experience with Dumbarton, Albion Rovers and Berwick. A sales rep.

Inside-forward **Alan Hughes**. Midfield man or striker, this tall youngster was signed from his home town junior club Yoker last year. A plater in a Clydeside shipyard.

Winger **Andy Scobie**. Fast, tricky player who was signed from Dunipace a couple of years ago. Just 20, he's a mining engineer.

Inside-forward **Martin Boyle**. Former Campsie Black Watch player, he joined 'Muir two years ago. Fast striking raider. A van driver.

Striker **Jim Wight**. Signed from Edinburgh juvenile club Whitehill Welfare a couple of seasons ago, he is nearly six-foot tall and very strong in the air. Club's top scorer this season. Works as a photographer.

Midfield man **Jim Richardson**. Veteran of the side, he originally joined the club in 1959 but later went to Australia for a three-year spell. Came back to Ochilview in 1966. Tremendously hard worker, with great drive and enthusiasm. A joiner to trade, but now a foreman estimator.

Winger **Colin McCullie**. Was bought from Cowdenbeath a month ago. A local man, he is a speedy raider who can cause trouble to defences. Works with the Gas Board in Falkirk.

Winger **Jim Lynn**. Member of Blantyre Vics Junior Cup-winning team a couple of years back. Then joined Albion Rovers for a year. Works in the Procurator Fiscal's office in Glasgow.

## MAN IN THE MIDDLE

Tom Kellock of East Kilbride is one of Scotland's most experienced referees. He has been a senior official for almost 13 years since serving his "apprenticeship" in juvenile and junior ranks.

Originally from Springburn, he played football at juvenile level in Glasgow.

More than eight years ago he moved with his wife and two daughters to East Kilbride and travels daily to work as a draughtsman with a South Side engineering firm.

Apart from football, referee Kellock has an interesting connection with another of Scotland's favourite sports golf. He is a grandson of the famous old-time golfer Andrew Kirkcaldy, who was professional at St. Andrews for many years.

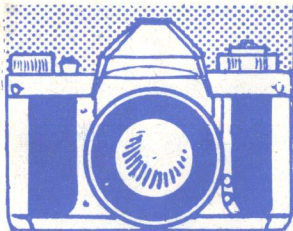

# Warning from Rangers

Rangers Football Club have urged all supporters clubs to follow their ten-point plan to curb hooliganism in the Stadium. Any supporter who does not adhere to these rules at Ibrox, or anywhere else for that matter, will be severely dealt with. So follow the Code . . . for the good name of the Club.

The ten golden rules are:

1. Ban the carrying of alcohol on buses.
2. Ban members from taking alcohol into the stadium.
3. Ban the singing of provocative songs in buses and on terracings.
4. Ban the use of obscene language.
5. Have the greatest respect for residents in the vicinity of football grounds. Do not be a public nuisance.
6. Put an end to members urinating at the road-side when travelling.
7. Set a good example to the youngsters who are travelling.
8. Impress on youth the importance of good behaviour.
9. Have respect for women who attend matches.
10. Notify Ibrox Stadium of any sign of hooliganism both home and away, giving report and details.

The Club, Police, Local Authorities and S.F.A. will back the supporters association in these measures.

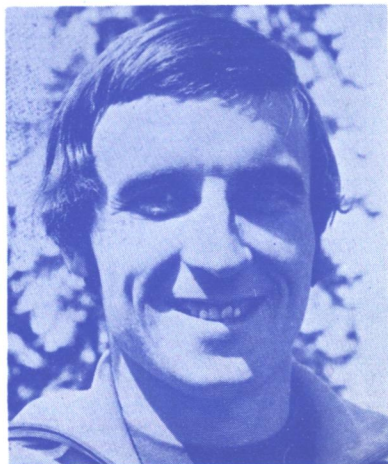
By the time the 'Well game comes around, the Colts are hoping to have slipped back into gear after faltering in recent weeks.

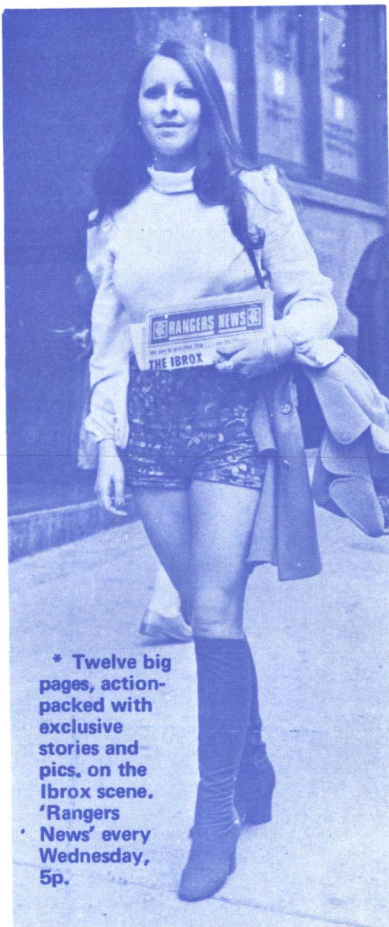
