DUMBARTON WILL BE TREATED WITH RESPECT

Dumbarton, in their last two visits to Ibrox, have left the stadium very satisfied with their 'haul' — having earned a 1-1 draw on each occasion.

Of course, you will realise that their visits to Ibrox can safely be called infrequent.

Their last appearance was ten years ago, September 19, 1972 to be exact. It was in the second leg of a League Cup quarter-final tie between the clubs.

Rangers won the first leg 3-1 at Boghead, but the battling Sons satisfied honour a little by getting that 1-1 score in the return.

The gap between that last appearance and the one before is even more considerable — 40 years, in fact!

It was back in 1922 that Sons last came to Ibrox on League business. They left with a point from a 1-1 draw, but that couldn't save them from relegation and it took the Boghead club half a century to recover First Division status.

It was entirely fitting that the Sons should come back up as Second Division champions at the end of last season — for 1972 marks the club's Centenary and there was no better way for them to celebrate the event than by making it back to the top.

So after 50 years, Sons are back at Ibrox looking for League points. And their showings this season indicate that the Boghead team deserve to be treated with the utmost respect.

They have picked up 10 points from their 12 games so far and have indeed drawn 2-2 no fewer than four times in their last six matches.

It's a steady performance from a newly-promoted team.

Today's visit will be Dumbarton's 31st on League business — and of the previous 30 Rangers have won 20 and drawn four of the games.

The teams have also clashed eight times in the Scottish Cup with Rangers winning five of the ties.

There are likely to be two 'survivors' from the last game between the clubs on the field today — Rangers skipper John Greig and Dumbarton's Davy Wilson, who was of course on the left wing for the Light Blues in those days but is still going strong.

It was big John who got the goal that day for Rangers in the drawn match, and since he also netted in the first leg the Ibrox skipper did his fair share towards dumping Dumbarton. Davy Wilson, incidentally, also netted at Boghead.

Today the Dumbarton team will come from the following pool:

Goalkeeper **LAWRIE WILLIAMS**. 5ft. 11in. 11½st. Signed from Port Glasgow Juniors in 1970 and has been first team choice more or less since. A maintenance fitter, he is married with three daughters.

Full back **GORDON MENZIES**. This six-foot, 11st. 10lbs. defender was signed from Kilsyth St. Pat's 18 months ago. Just 20, he is a student at Strathclyde University.

Full back **BILLY WILKINSON**. Another well-built six-footer, he was signed from Balloch Juveniles then farmed out to junior club St. Anthony's. He came into the first team last season and has never looked back. He's 21, an electrician

and married with a recently-arrived daughter. Ever present this term.

Half-back **JOHN CUSHLEY**. The tall, powerful Cushley has lined up against Rangers many times in the past with his previous clubs Celtic and Dunfermline (whom he joined after a spell in England with First Division West Ham). Strong tackler, he is a university graduate and teaches at Motherwell Technical College.

Centre half **JACK BOLTON**. Joined the club in September 1970 from Raith Rovers. 6ft., 12st. 4lbs. Very difficult to beat in the air and has had plenty of experience having been with Morton and Ipswich. Married with three children, he is a maintenance fitter with the Gas Board.

Wing half **JOHNNY GRAHAM**. 5ft. 8in., 10st. 6lbs. Skilful midfield player who signed for Sons in February 1968 from Arthurlie. Married with two children, he works with a whisky firm in his home town of Paisley. Never missed a game this season.

Forward **PETER COLEMAN**. 5ft. 6½in., 10st. 4lbs. Signed from Albion Rovers in 1970. A clever ball playing forward with a turn of speed, he can double up in midfield as well. Works with a transport firm. Married with a daughter.

Forward **KENNY JENKINS**. 5ft. 9in., 11st. Calling him a forward doesn't tell the true story — this son of former Rangers goalkeeper George Jenkins has worn the No. 2, 4, 9, 8 and 10 jerseys for Sons this season and only missed one match. Voted 'Player of the Year' by the Dumbarton Supporters last season. Married with one of a family he is an electrician.

Striker **ROY McCORMACK**. Dumbarton's longest serving player having signed in 1967 from Yoker. Tops 6ft. and weighs in at nearly 12 stone. Strong, forceful leader who can make as well as take goals. Married last year, he works in Glasgow in the printing industry.

Striker **TOM McADAM**. This 18-year-old has been a sensation since he came into the first team seven games ago as replacement for Kenny Wilson who was transferred to Carlisle. Has netted in every game, and indeed got the two goals against Morton last week to take his tally to eight in seven matches. 6ft. and 11st., he was in the Under-23 side which played against the Scottish Youths at Easter Road on Monday night — so that shows how quickly his talent has been recognised. He was Dumbarton's first 'S' form signing, joining them in 1971 from Weirs Amateurs. A carpet fitter, his brother Colin is also on the Boghead playing staff.

Outside left **DAVY WILSON**. Needs no introduction to Rangers fans — having been a stalwart in the Ibrox side of the 1950's and 60's. Has won every honour in the game in Scotland and he was capped 29 times in a long and illustrious career. Recently opened a restaurant in Glasgow's Broomielaw area.

MAN IN THE MIDDLE

BERT PADDEN

Bert Padden of Ardrossan has been refereeing since 1958, the last 11 of them on the official list. He has been a Grade One man for the past seven years. Formerly a goalkeeper with Kilwinning Rangers, he has worked with the I.C.I. in Ardeer for the past 18 years in the repellants research division. Married with a girl of 17 and a boy of 12, he says refereeing is his only hobby. "It takes up so much time — travelling, training and attending meetings I have no time for any other hobby", says Mr. Padden. "But I enjoy it. Every referee does, otherwise he wouldn't stay with it". Was in charge at Kilbowie earlier in the season when Rangers beat Clydebank 5-0 in the League Cup.

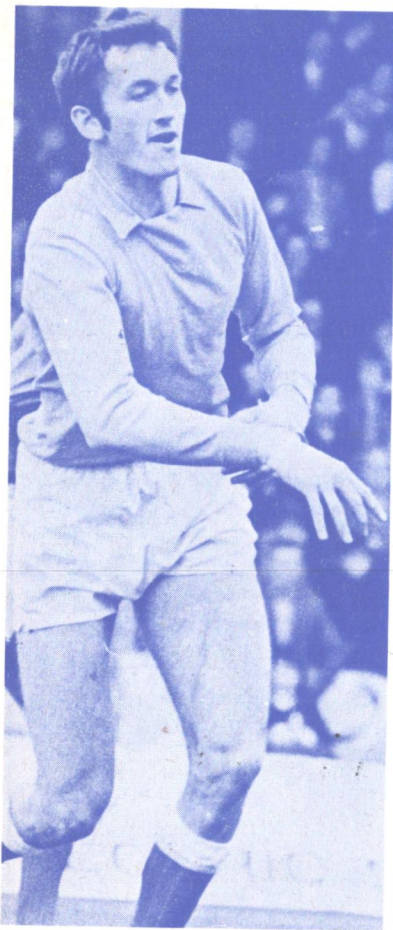

5. Have the greatest respect for residents in the vicinity of football grounds. Do not be a public nuisance.
6. Put an end to members urinating at the road-side when travelling.
7. Set a good example to the youngsters who are travelling.
8. Impress on youth the importance of good behaviour.
9. Have respect for women who attend matches.
10. Notify Ibrox Stadium of any sign of hooliganism both home and away, giving report and details.

The Club, Police, Local Authorities and S.F.A. will back the supporters association in these measures.

RESERVE REVIEW

YOUNG McDOUGALL MAKES HIS MARK

A goal lost two minutes from time pipped the Ibrox Reserves from getting what would have been a deserved, and very welcome win over Hibs last Saturday.

The Colts were leading 1-0 at half-time and seemed to be heading for victory despite Hibs pressure in the final 15 minutes until they cracked two minutes before the break.

"A win would have made quite a difference since nearly all the top teams in the table drew", says coach Stan Anderson. "Another point would have been a big help.

"However, I felt we played quite well until near the end and certainly our first half goal by Ian McDougall was a cracker".

The young striker crashed the ball into the net from 30 yards having earlier banged a shot against the bar. The former Pollok junior also brought out a great save from the Hibs keeper later in the game and his shooting form was impressive — as it has been in recent weeks.

He has now boosted his tally to five — two behind leading scorer Billy McNichol.

"Ian McDougall is making very good progress", says coach Anderson. "He is a strong runner, very skilful and can score goals. If he

continues to improve like this we will all be delighted".

Two more players in top form against Hibs were Jim Denny who was at inside forward for the first few minutes of the game then dropped back to play well as sweeper.

And young George Struthers turned in another fine performance.

"George really is playing well", says coach Anderson. "He is a really intelligent player and uses the ball so well for a full back".

The overall form of the team is pleasing the Ibrox coach, particularly the way the young players are helping each other along.

Now the Ibrox aim is to put that result behind them and concentrate on the League campaign and the bid to keep up the recent victory form which has sent the team climbing up the table.
