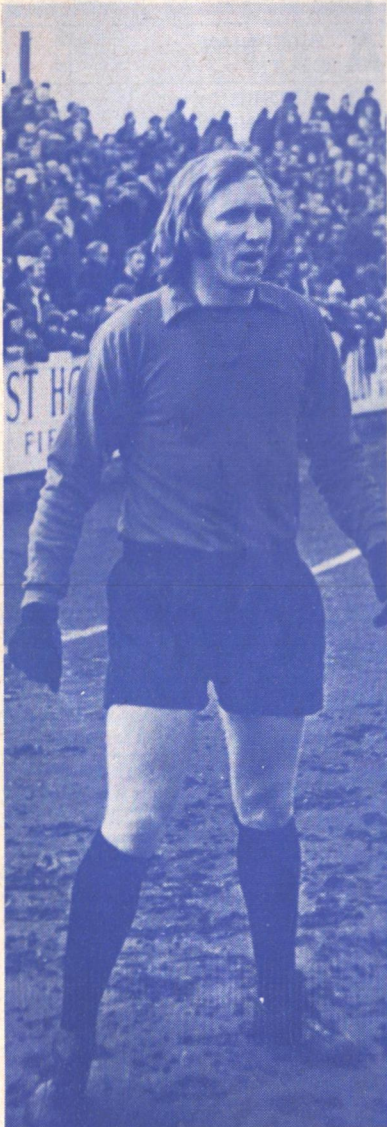

FIFERS LOOK FOR EUROPE TOUR BOOST

EAST FIFE come to Ibrox today knowing that Rangers will be going flat-out for victory. But although the Fifers may not have quite the same incentive as the Light Blues, they are determined to get a good result.

For within 24 hours of today's game, the Bayview squad will be on their way to Europe for a three-game end-of-season tour.

"And we'd like to leave for Holland with the boost of a good result at Ibrox behind us", says manager Pat Quinn.

The Fifers will play two games in Holland and one in Germany and have a meeting with Wolves lined up at Bayview on their return.

Main object of these games is to give the part-time club a chance to work and mix together just like a full-time side. Indeed, another pre-season European tour is lined up as well.

But the trip is also a 'well done' bonus for the Bayview players for their much-improved League performance this season.

Last term, their first season up after a long spell in the Second Division, the Fifers had a tremendous fight to stay in the top division — and just made it by a point. They finished in third bottom place, a point ahead of Clyde.

This year has been a much happier and rewarding one for the Methil men, who are currently in the top half of the table and hopeful of finishing in the top ten.

The records, however, are not encouraging as far as the Fifers' ambitions are concerned about today's game.

This will be the 26th League meeting between the clubs — and only four times in the previous 25 clashes have East Fife managed a win . . . but never at Ibrox!

The best they have managed in their 12 previous League visits to Ibrox is to draw on three occasions — 2-2 in 1949-50, 1-1 in 51-52 and 3-3 in 57-58.

East Fife were formed in 1903 and their first big impact in Scottish football was in 1938 when they won the Scottish Cup, beating Kilmarnock 4-2 at Hampden after a 1-1 draw. **THE FIFERS WERE A SECOND DIVISION TEAM AT THE TIME AND THEIR WIN WAS A REAL SENSATION.**

That was to establish the Fifers as a team with a great Cup tradition, and they kept the reputation going when play resumed after the war.

They lost to Rangers in the quarter-finals of the Scottish in 47-48, went down to the Light Blues in the semi-finals the following year at Hampden then in 49-50 battled through to the Final only to crash to Rangers once again, going down 3-0 at Hampden.

In the League Cup, the Fifers had much more success — winning the trophy three times in seven years — 47-48, 49-50, 53-54.

The Fife team today will come from the following pool of players:

GOALKEEPER ERNIE MCGARR. Tall former Aberdeen and Dunfermline man who won Under-23 honours while at Pittodrie. Joined East Fife this season and, after sharing the first-team berth with John Gorman, established himself



as first choice and has been in goal for the past nine games in a row. Works with the club's official Pools.

FULL BACK BOBBY DUNCAN. Born 27.4.45. Big, powerful player who joined the Fifers in July, 1971, from Hibs. Broke his leg while at Easter Road but has recovered completely to become a Bayview regular, making 40 appearances last season. Works with a security firm.

FULL BACK DAVE CLARKE. Club skipper. Born 26.6.50. Signed from Edinburgh youth football in 1968 and plays either full back or sweeper. Determined defender, he's 5ft. 7½in. and 10st. 7lbs. Works as an electrician in a Kirkcaldy colliery.

WING HALF WALTER BORTHWICK. Former Youth cap in his days with Morton. Joined up at Bayview in 1967. Born 4.4.48. 5ft. 9½in. 11 stone. Versatile type who has played in the No. 10, 9, 8, 6 and 4 jerseys this season. He's a civil servant.

CENTRE-HALF JOHN MARTIS. Veteran of the side and a man who played alongside manager Pat Quinn in the Motherwell side of the early 60's.

Now 33 but playing as well as ever. Had a spell in South African football before joining the Fifers in 1969. 5ft. 11in. 12st. 4lbs. Won Scottish cap against Wales in 1961. Works as a maintenance plumber in Lanarkshire steel works.

WING HALF JIM HAMILTON. Born 3.2.51. Was signed from Aberdeen in 1971 and has established himself as a key midfield player with the Fifers. 5ft. 10in. 10st. 12lbs. Has played in No. 10, 8, 6 and 4 jerseys for the Bayview club. Works with a printing company.

STRIKER KEVIN HEGARTY. Ex-Hearts and Carlisle United. Born 30.7.50 and joined up at Methil almost a year ago. 5ft. 10in. 10st. Goal-grabbing forward who has banged in 15 so far this season. Works as a printer in Buckhaven.

FORWARD JOHN LOVE. Born 21.7.52. Signed from Penicuik Juniors in 1970. 5ft. 9in. 10st. 10½lbs. Scored inside 30 seconds against St. Johnstone last week. Works with an insurance firm.

FORWARD DOUG DAILEY. Born 6.3.53 — on the Isle of Man. Signed from Glenrothes juvenile side in 1970. 5ft. 9½in. 11st. 9lbs. Youngster who has gradually been working his way into a permanent first team position. A motor mechanic.

FORWARD GRAHAM HONEYMAN. Born 30.5.53. Signed from junior club Frances Colliery in 1970. 5ft. 11in. 10st. 7lbs. A civil servant in Dundee, he has attracted the attention of a number of English clubs.

FORWARD BILLY McPHEE. Born 12.6.49. A former Rangers winger, he has now established himself as a marksman with the Fifers. He joined them in 1970 from Ibrox and scored 24 goals in his first season, 11 the next and now this term has banged in 23, including seven penalties. A 'dead ball' expert who is dangerous with free kicks round the goal. A civil servant.

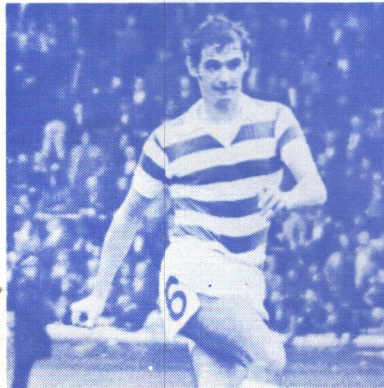

IT'S THE TENTH OLD FIRM FINAL

Today starts a two-game vital week for Rangers which brings season 1972-73 to a dramatic climax – with the League Championship decided today and the Scottish Cup Final coming up against Celtic at Hampden next Saturday.

No matter what happens at Easter Road today in the Hibs-Celtic game, Rangers main concentration is to beat East Fife this afternoon. If they succeed, then they have given everything possible in pursuit of the title, recovering from a poor start to the flag race to come powering back with an unbeaten run over the past 19 matches.

Next week's Cup Final will be the 10th contested by the clubs, and the 26th time they have clashed in the competition. Seven of the ties have needed replays, including four of the Finals.

So clearly it is going to be just as tight and as exciting as you would expect. Rangers will give the Final the same determination, dedication and victory effort as they have every match this season.

The aim is to win, and bring the trophy to Ibrox for the first time since 1966. It would be a fitting success to mark the end of a season of tremendous effort and promise for the future. The full list of results in the previous Cup meetings with Celtic reads:

GOAL-HAPPY COLTS BACK IN GROOVE

Sixteen goals scored and one conceded — that's the fine record of the Ibrox Reserve side in the past five matches (not including the midweek meeting with Airdrie). It's a performance which has delighted coach Stan Anderson — and sent the team climbing up the table.

"The team has really found form again — the kind of football they were displaying nearer the beginning of the season before they began to struggle at the turn of the year," says coach Anderson.

The Colts' fine run began on April 7 with a 2-1 win over Hearts. Then a few days later they beat St. Johnstone 3-0, followed this up two days after that with a 5-0 win over Falkirk. They then travelled to Tannadice to rack up their fourth win in a week with a 1-0 victory over Dundee United, and climaxed it all with a stunning 5-0 win over Aberdeen at Ibrox last Saturday.

"Aberdeen have been a fine team all season and are the Reserve League champions, so the win was really terrific," says coach Anderson.

"We have improved 200 per cent in the past few weeks, finding our

best form again and playing the way I know we can."

Part of the reason for the loss of form in the middle of the

season was probably the chopping and changing in the side to make sure that the in-form players were standing by to supplement the first team pool whenever necessary.

However, it is the future which is concerning coach Anderson now, and he is thoroughly pleased with the form being shown by the younger players.

"George Donaldson has come right back to form in recent weeks in midfield after a sticky spell," says coach Anderson. "We moved him into the back four for a few games and this has obviously been a help to him."

Two 16-year-olds who have come on in the past few games and impressed greatly are forwards Alex O'Hara and Billy Steel.

"They will be challenging for a permanent place in the second team next season. Both are very promising players".

It was O'Hara who opened the scoring in the first half against Aberdeen, although Ian McDougall took a lot of credit for a strong run and shot which the 'keeper couldn't hold, and young Alex was on the spot to bang in the rebound.

Then in the second half the Reserves really got the goals going. Graham Fyfe banged in a double, Billy Steel hit one and Ian McDougall another.

Another six!

The Reserves kept their great scoring run going with a 6-0 win over Airdrie at Ibrox on Wednesday night. All the goals came in the second half as the Colts cut loose

after a scrappy first 45 minutes. Alex Miller started the goal rush with a penalty, trialist McGregor hit a couple, young Alex O'Hara banged in two — taking his total to four in three games — and Iain McDonald got one in a win which delighted everyone.

Warning from Rangers

Rangers Football Club have urged all supporters clubs to follow their ten-point plan to curb hooliganism in the Stadium. Any supporter who does not adhere to these rules at Ibrox, or anywhere else for that matter, will be severely dealt with. So follow the Code . . . for the good name of the Club.

The ten golden rules are:

1. Ban the carrying of alcohol on buses.
2. Ban members from taking alcohol into the stadium.
3. Ban the singing of provocative songs in buses and on terracings.
4. Ban the use of obscene language.
5. Have the greatest respect for residents in the vicinity of football grounds. Do not be a public nuisance.
6. Put an end to members urinating at the road-side when travelling.
7. Set a good example to the youngsters who are travelling.
8. Impress on youth the importance of good behaviour.
9. Have respect for women who attend matches.
10. Notify Ibrox Stadium of any sign of hooliganism both home and away, giving report and details.

The Club, Police, Local Authorities and S.F.A. will back the supporters association in these measures.

... AND PLAY IT SAFE!

Rangers Football Club ask all fans to co-operate and make sure that everyone leaves the ground with the maximum of comfort and safety by following this procedure at the end of the game:

1. Take your time leaving the Stadium.
2. If you see that passages or stairways are becoming jammed — hold back. You will only be delayed for a few moments.
3. Help any youngster, old person — anyone, in fact — if you think they are having difficulty.
4. Be particularly careful on the exit stairs, and avoid jostling as much as possible.
5. Abide by Stewards' and Police Instructions.
