# Watch out!

**"It will certainly be strange playing at Ibrox in the Visiting team. But I won't let it worry me. It's just going to be another game as far as I'm concerned. And a game I think we can win".**

That's Motherwell skipper Bobby Watson, transferred from Rangers in April, speaking about tonight's League Cup clash at Ibrox.

And, as can be gathered from Bobby's tone, the Fir Park men are confident they can get the result they want—despite the fact that Rangers beat them 2-0 at Motherwell last Wednesday night.

*"I thought we had as much of the game as Rangers at Fir Park—but then lost two late goals," says Bobby. "As far as we are concerned we have a great chance of winning tonight."*

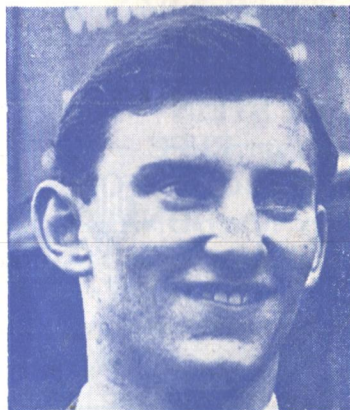
But despite the fact that this will be his first appearance at Ibrox since he moved to Motherwell in the part-exchange deal for Peter McCloy, Bobby in no way regards this as a personal "revenge" match.

*"I have too many friends at Ibrox and spent too many years with the club to harbour ill feelings," says Bobby, who had a fine match in the first meeting.*

There are two other ex-Rangers men in the Fir Park side—goalkeeper Billy Ritchie who joined Partick Thistle after leaving Ibrox and was then fixed up with 'Well at the start of this season.

On the left wing will be Brian Heron, who also figured in the swap deal which brought Peter McCloy to Ibrox. A fourth ex-Ranger, Tom Donnelly, is in Motherwell's first team

pool so the Fir Parkers can certainly claim to have 'inside' knowledge of how Rangers work.

The Fir Park team will be chosen from the following pool:

**BILLY RITCHIE.** 33-year-old ex-Ranger signed only a few weeks ago after being released by Partick Thistle. Billy is a Justice of the Peace in Livingston New Town, where he runs a newsagents shop.

**DAVIE WHITEFORD.** Hard-tackling, athletic full-back who was shaken off a back injury which kept him out for most of last season. Davie, a full-timer, is 24 and is a fine volley ball player.

**JOE WARK.** A 22-year-old who lives in Govan, left-back Wark was signed from junior side Irvine Vics in 1967. A great favourite with the Fir Park fans because of his fine ball control which can ease him out of what seems a dangerous situation. Wark, too, once moved up into

the attack when Motherwell were 1-0 down to Montrose with 20 minutes to go—and hit a hat-trick.

**TOMMY FORSYTH.** Only part-timer in 'Well's first team squad, but you would never know it. Tops the 6 ft. mark, and was a Motherwell fan when signed from Stonehouse (as an inside-forward) three years ago. A joiner to trade—and a great defensive-cum-attacking wing-half.

**WILLIE McCALLUM.** Tall centre-half who has been with Motherwell for 11 years, signing up from Douglas Water Thistle. An ex-Dalziel High School player he was a wing-half for many years but then took over the pivot spot and made it his own. Slim, but tackles hard.

**BOBBY WATSON.** 23-year-old ex-Ranger who joined the club in April and quickly established himself as such a top-class man that he was appointed captain. Powerhouse in midfield, and a formidable opponent when it comes to a tackle. Bobby is a quantity surveyor and lives in Airdrie.

**BILLY CAMPBELL.** Slim little Irish international winger with a devastating turn of speed. 25-year-old Billy joined up at Fir Park earlier this season in an exchange deal which took Jimmy Wilson to Dundee.

**JIM MUIR.** 'Jumbo' to the Fir Park fans, who find him a frustrating character. Opponents find him that too—and dangerous as well. Signed the same week as Joe Wark from the same junior club, Irvine Vics. Is 22, an ex-foundry worker now full time and lives in Kilwinning. Looks awkward—but is hard to handle, as far as defenders are concerned.

**JOHN GOLDTHORP.** Has finally broken clear of a long injury spell and his classy play in midfield has established him as a key man for

The long-legged **JACKIE McINALLY** is one of the most difficult forwards in the country to halt when he starts in a run for goal. Powerful in the air, too. 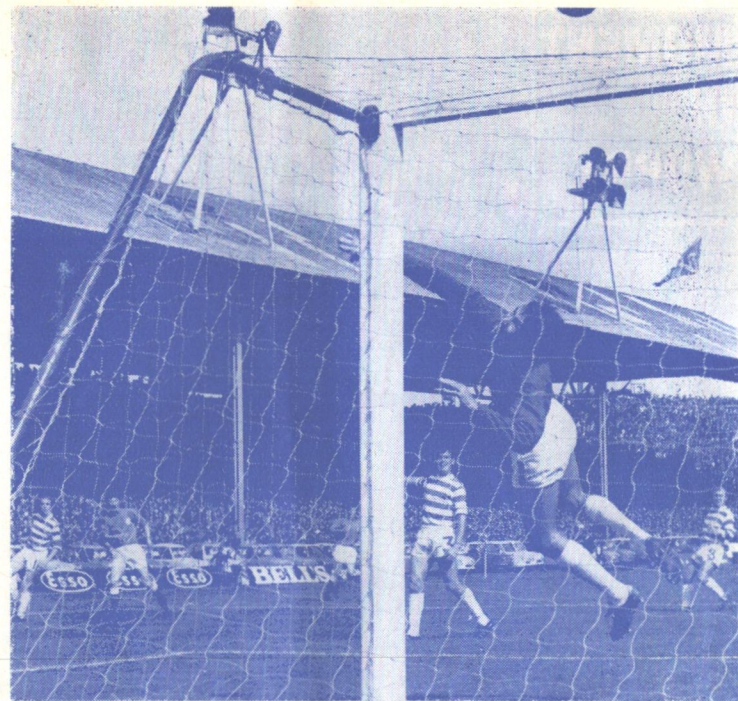
