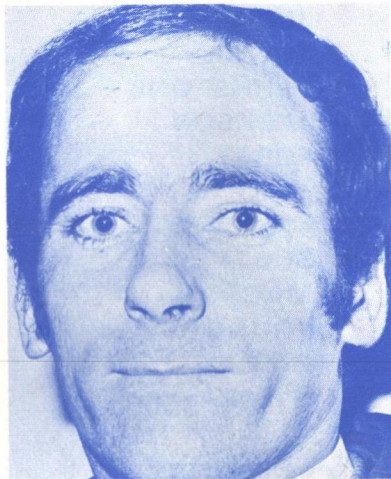

'GERS WON'T GET IT EASY

—Clyde boss
Stan Anderson

CLYDE come to Ibrox today heartened by the 3-0 away win over Airdrie at Broomfield last week—which illustrates the fighting qualities of the Shawfielders.

However, this can be no surprise to anyone who knows Clyde boss Stan Anderson.

Stan left his post as second team coach at Ibrox last season to take on the job of managing Clyde, for whom he played successfully for a number of years.

And during his Ibrox spell (he was a former Rangers player as well, of course) his rugged determination was obvious. Stan's a fighter—and any team guided by him will be the same.

So there will be no complacency among the Rangers players today. They know only

too well that Clyde will be geared to go all the way.

Manager Anderson admits openly that his aim this season is the same as so many other Scots bosses—a place in the top 10 for next season's Premier League.

And he knows that to hit the target, Clyde have got to produce the wins at home.

"We'll give everyone a hard game at Shawfield" says Stan. "Away from home it will be harder—but we showed at Broomfield last Saturday that we have the ability to pull off

away victories as well.

"The fight for a top 10 place is going to be hard and gruelling. We can't afford to relax at any time. Rangers may be favourites today, but they won't get it easy".

Ibrox boss Jock Wallace, still a close friend of his Shawfield counterpart, realises this well and will have hammered home this point in training during the week.

However, despite the Clyde determination the record books are loaded heavily against the Shawfielders. Today will be the 125th League meeting between the clubs—and Clyde have only 12 of these games.

Indeed, only five times have they ever left Ibrox with two

points from a League victory. The last time was back in 1955-56 when they won 1-0 in the last match of the season.

Over the years Rangers have handed out some heavy defeats to the Shawfielders—winning by margins of eight goals, seven goals and frequently six goals.

Clyde have been relegated eight times, but only once have they spent more than a season in the Second Division—1924 to 1926—which is another testimony to the fighting spirit that the club possesses.

Currently the fight is not to avoid relegation, but for that coveted top 10 place. They are a part-time side, so the struggle is even harder for them.

But under the drive of Stan Anderson it is certain that Clyde will not fail for want of fighting effort.

★ Goalkeeper **EVAN WILLIAMS**. 5ft 11in, 11st. Ex-Celtic, Wolves and Third Lanark keeper who joined Clyde at the end of last season on a free from Parkhead. Vastly experienced keeper. Married with five daughters, he owns several pubs in and around his home town of Dumbarton.

★ Goalkeeper **PHIL CAIRNEY**. 5ft 11in, 11st 10lbs. Signed from juvenile football in 1970 and quickly made the break through. Didn't miss a League game last season and only two the term before that but has had to fight for the first team berth this season. P.E. Student at Jordanhill College.

★ Full back **JIM BURNS**. 5ft 8in, 11st. Seasoned campaigner who can turn out in a variety of positions but has settled at full back this term. Was signed from Cowdenbeath in 1968, which makes him one of the club's longest serving players. A joiner to trade, he comes from Stirling. Didn't miss a League match last season.

★ Full back **ALAN SWAN**. 5ft 9in, 10st 10lbs. Joined Clyde in 1970 from Shettleston juniors as a striker but then developed into a hard-tackling defender. Can also turn out in midfield. Played in every League match last season. Works as a post office engineer.

★ Wing-half **BRIAN AHERN**. 5ft 9in, 10st 10lbs. Was signed from juvenile football in 1970. Clever, driving midfielder player with a goal touch. Recently married, he originates from Rutherglen and works in savings bank at Cowglen.

★ Centre half **WILLIE McVIE**. 6ft, 12st. Big, tough pivot who is rated as the best in the country right now by manager Anderson. Signed from Lanarkshire junior club Lesmahagow in 1967, which makes him the club's second longest serving player. A plumber, he works with Lanarkshire County Council.

★ Wing-half **ALEX PRINGLE**. 5ft 9in, 11st. Former Hibs and Dundee player who was signed on a free transfer only a few weeks ago. Skilful sweeper, who reads the game well.

★ Outside right **DOMINIC SULLIVAN**. 5ft 10in, 10st 12lbs. Joined Clyde from Glasgow junior club St. Roch in 1969 and has been a regular first team man ever since. Tricky ball-hugging winger of the old school. Has been on the verge of League international honours and has been watched by bigger clubs several times. Works as a local government officer in Glasgow. Only missed one League game last season, and even then came on as substitute.

★ Forward **SAM MILLER**. 5ft 11in, 11st 3lbs. Big, hard-hitting striker or midfielder man who didn't miss a League match last season and scored eight goals in all matches. Already holds an M.A. degree at Glasgow University, but is still studying.

★ Forward **BOBBY FERRIS**. One of the up and coming young Clyde stars. Only in his second season after joining up from local Fernhill amateur club. Still a teenager, he comes from Rutherglen but works as an auto-electrician with Glasgow Corporation.

★ Forward **JOE WARD**. 5ft 11in, 11st 2lbs. A first-season senior who was signed a few months ago from St. Roch's. Big, aggressive forward who can grab the goals and only needs more time and experience. He's a student.

★ Forward **GERRY MARSHALL**. 5ft 9in, 10st 4lbs. Another teenager making the break-through. Signed from Ayrshire junior football a year ago. Clever ball-player with a fine knack for the open space. Works as a stock-taker in Glasgow bottling firm.

★ Forward **BOBBY HARVEY**. 5ft 9in, 10st 7lbs. Another local youngster—he's from Rutherglen—who started to make the break-through last season and has now established himself as a first-team candidate. His hat-trick against Airdrie last week won't do him any harm! Works as a clerk with Lanarkshire County Council.

★ Forward **PETER BOYLE**. 5ft 9in, 10st 7lbs. Unorthodox winger who likes to come inside looking for goals. Gets a few, too! Hasn't quite found his best form this season but can still be a menace. Works as an industrial chemist in Lanarkshire. Was signed from Larkhall Thistle two years ago and was the club's top scorer last season with 15 goals.

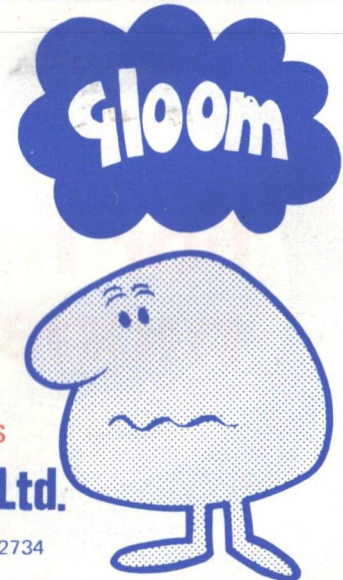

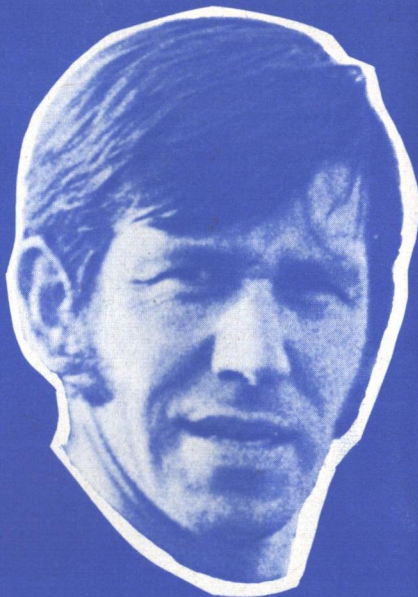

"ONE of the worst starts I've ever had to a season." That's Ibrox skipper John Greig's verdict on 74-75 so far.

He hastens to add that it has nothing to do with the team performance—which has delighted captain Greig.

"I'm talking about injuries" says John. "I've played in less than half the matches so far because of a troublesome muscle injury.

"Now the injury is back again. I'll just have to hope that it clears up quickly."

John was taken off in the second half against Dunfermline because of the muscle pull.

"It's the third time I've pulled the same ham-string" says John. "I never had any trouble with that kind of injury before—only once before in my life until the present

trouble started against Hearts last season. The whole thing is sickening.

"Especially with the team going so well. I had to fight hard to get back into the side after my injury early this season and I felt I was just beginning to settle in at left back."

Like all the Ibrox players, skipper Greig is taking the championship challenge calmly.

"There is a long way to go yet. We'll just take each game at a time. We've only played seven games so it's too early to talk about titles."

"However it's nice to be out in front. The pressure is on the others to catch us for a change. We can even afford to drop a point and still stay at the top. Not that we intend to slip-up. If we keep winning, we can't be caught."

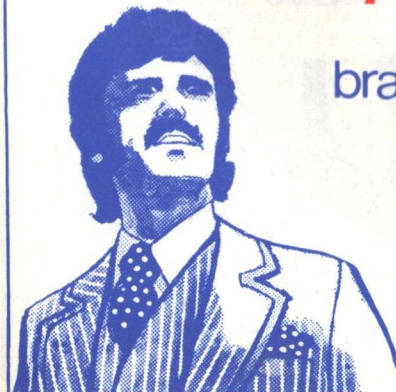

IT'S only a couple of weeks since Derek Parlane was lamenting in *Match Magazine* about missing out in the six-goal victory over Kilmarnock at Rugby Park.

He felt that his goal touch, which was missing at that time, would have come back in that game. But there were no complaints from Derek after last week's 6-1 victory over Dunfermline at East End Park... for he not only took part, he hit five of the goals.

Naturally he's delighted—

and so is manager Jock Wallace who knew that Derek's goal touch was bound to come back.

"I felt that if I could get one or maybe two goals that would really get me going" said Derek. "But five—that was fantastic.

Colts creep nearer to the top

SLOWLY but surely, the Ibrox reserves are making their way toward the top of the Reserve League—and towards their second title win in a row.

Currently they lie in second place, a point behind leaders Motherwell, but with a game in hand.

Last week the Colts won 3-2 against Dunfermline at Ibrox—but not before giving coach Joe Mason a few bad moments.

"We were two up, brought back to level and only got the winner a couple of minutes from the end" says Joe.

"Not the kind of thing I'd like to happen regularly. It's bad for

the nerves. But really, it was a fine game with plenty of good football and chances going at both ends.

"After we were drawn back to 2-2, I had to take a chance and order the team into full attack. We could have lost one because we committed ourselves so much in attack but the move paid off."

Alex O'Hara put the Reserves ahead in 20 minutes, then Eric Morris got another 14 minutes later. But Dunfermline hit back to get one before the interval, and then after the break drew level.

It was a tremendous battle after that until Billy Steele, brought on as substitute for Gordon Boyd, snatched the winner.

That was young Steele's ninth goal of the season—in only 10 full appearances. Pretty

good shooting, and Billy is obviously well on his way to his No. 1 target . . . which is to beat the total of 16 goals which made him top marksman in the Colts last season.
