# THAT IT'S BETTER THAN THE LAST ONE

**RANGERS' manager, Jock Wallace has only one wish for the new season which gets under way today: "I just hope it's better than the last one!"**

Which is just an example of the Ibrox manager's determination that the championship-winning performance of last term will be surpassed this season.

One trophy isn't enough for Jock. He wants to win the lot in Scotland.

"And there is the European Cup, as well," he adds.

However, Jock fully expects that the defence of the League flag will be tremendously tough



for Rangers in the new Premier League set-up.

"It's going to be very competitive," says Jock. "I think this could be a terrific season up here. Everyone will be going flat-out.

"I'm just hoping we can get away to as good a start in the League this season as we did last term. That will do me for starters."

The Ibrox boss is delighted with the way his men have worked in pre-season training.

"They're ready," he says confidently. "Now I expect them to go out and prove me right."

#### What John and Sandy say

Two of the Ibrox seasoned campaigners, skipper John Greig and World Cup full back Sandy Jardine are looking forward to the new season with relish—and like boss Wallace anticipate a cracking year in Scotland.

"It will be cut and thrust," says captain Greig. "No team can afford to be over-confident. There will be no such thing as an easy game."

And Sandy predicts a season where there will be tremendous pressure on players.

"No one will be able to relax. There will be great games every Saturday," he says. "It should be terrific."

# THE DAY DIAMONDS WON 11-1 !

**AIRDRIE were founded in 1878. Their ground, Broomfield Park, has a record attendance of 24,000 set against Hearts in a First Division game in 1952.**

The Broomfielders have never won the First Division championship—but for four years in succession they finished runners-up. In 1923, 24 and 25 they were second to Rangers then in 1926 finished in No. 2 spot behind Celtic. They have won the Second Division championship three times—1903, 1955 and 1974.

They have never won the League Cup, but in 1924 they battled through to the Final of the Scottish Cup and beat Hibs 2-0 at Hampden. Last season, of course, they made a magnificent effort in the Cup again and reached Hampden once more ... only to lose 3-1 to Celtic this time.

In 1972 they beat Manchester City, Huddersfield and Ballymena to reach the Final of the Texaco Cup, where they lost 2-1 on aggregate to Derby County over two matches.

Their biggest victory was 11-1 against Falkirk in a First Division game in 1950-51 and their worst defeat was the same score at the hands of Hibs in 1959-60.

The club colours are a white shirt with a red diamond collar, white shorts and black stockings with red and white tops.

The club nicknames are naturally "Diamonds", although they are also known as the "Waysiders" or "Broomfielders".

#### The Manager

Ian McMillan is Airdrie born and bred—reared within listening distance of the Broomfield roars on a Saturday afternoon. He was always an Airdrie fan, and stepped up to them from the local school as a boy.

#### The Players

★ Goalkeeper **DAVE McWILLIAMS**. 6ft 3½, 11st 6lbs. Looks like a Viking with his giant frame and beard. A former Rangers signing, he was released and joined Alloa then moved

to Airdrie in 1973 for a good fee. He played in all 52 games for the club last season and won Under 23 international recognition, being in the pool against Sweden and Rumania.

★ Full-back **PAUL JONQUIN**. 5ft 11in, 11st. The club's longest-serving player, having signed for them in 1960. Still retains the skill, speed and enthusiasm which has made him one of the best club defenders in the country. Played in all 52 matches last season, and scored 13 goals—eight of them from the penalty spot.

★ Full-back **JOHN LAPSLEY**. 5ft 9in, 11st 2lbs. Was an inside forward when signed from Linlithgow Rose in 1972, and can still turn out in attack when needed—nine of his 41 appearances last season were up front.

★ Full back or midfielder man **MARK COWAN**. 5ft 11in, 12st. Strong, determined player who can turn out in a variety of positions (he played in the number 5, 8, 3 and 10 jerseys last term). Made 40 appearances last season. Joined the club in 1969 when he returned from West Bromwich Albion.

★ Wing-half **JOHN MENZIES**. 5ft 9½in, 11st. Not big, but a tremendous competitor. Turned out at No. 4, 9, 8, 3 and 10 for Airdrie in 36 appearances last season. Was signed from Partick Thistle in 1966 and has been a really solid club man.

## TODAY'S OPPONENTS

★ Centre-half **JIM BLACK**. 5ft 11in, 11st 4lbs. Returned to Airdrie last season after a five year spell with Hibs. Played in all but two matches last season. Strong, good in the air he is a dependable player on all occasions.

★ Wing-half **DEREK WHITEFORD**. 6ft, 13st 6lbs. The club captain, and an inspiring example to his men. Grafts for the full 90 minutes in midfield where he tackles powerfully. Can also come through to get the goals and back up his forwards—netting 13 last season. A former Hibs player he was signed in 1967. Played in 50 games last season.

★ Winger **KEVIN McCANN**. 5ft 7in, 10st 6lbs. Small, tricky winger who can play on either touchline. Made 38 appearances last season. Was signed from Carlisle in 1972.

★ Midfield man **TOMMY WALKER**. 5ft 10in, 11st 6lbs. Is in his second spell with Airdrie, having made the journey from Arbroath twice to join the Broomfielders. Big, skilful player who looks deceptively slow, he won Under-23 recognition last season. Played in 40 games for Airdrie and scored eight goals.

★ Striker **WILLIE McCULLOCH**. 5ft 10in, 11st 12lbs. Signed from Alloa in 1973, he is a strong rugged centre forward of the old Scottish type—he simply gets in about everything scoring himself and creating openings for others because of his upsetting determination. Played in 46 games last season and scored 15 goals.

★ Midfield man **TOMMY REYNOLDS**. 5ft 7in, 9st. Joined Airdrie from Ayr United in 1973. Small, tricky midfielder man but can also turn out on the wings. Played in 39 matches and scored three goals last season.

★ Winger **BILLY WILSON**. 5ft 7in, 10st 6lbs. Small, stocky and talented. Was signed from Kilsyth junior club in 1967. Made 38 appearances last season and scored 8 goals.

★ Forward **ALLY McROBERTS**. 5ft 10in, 10st 7lbs. Signed from Lanarkshire minor football in 1972 and showed up well in his early seasons. But his form shaded last season and he made only eight full and eight substitute appearances, whereas the season before he had played in every league match and scored 23 League goals.

★ Forward **JIM MARCH**. 6ft 2in, 11st 10lbs. Signed from St. Roch's in 1973 and is just beginning to make an impact. Big, powerful fellow, he banged in a hat-trick against Dunfermline last season. Made two full and five substitute appearances.

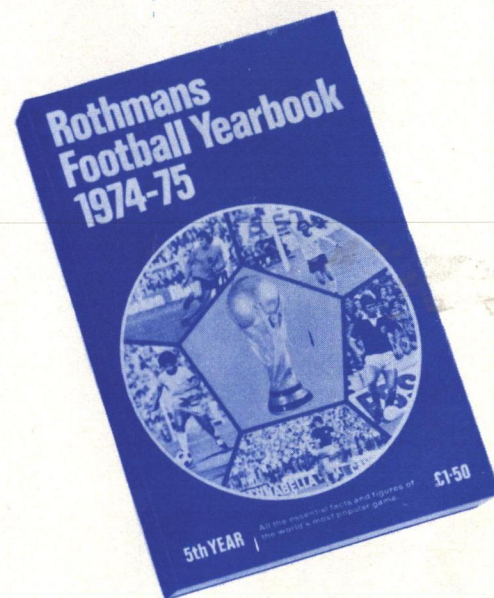

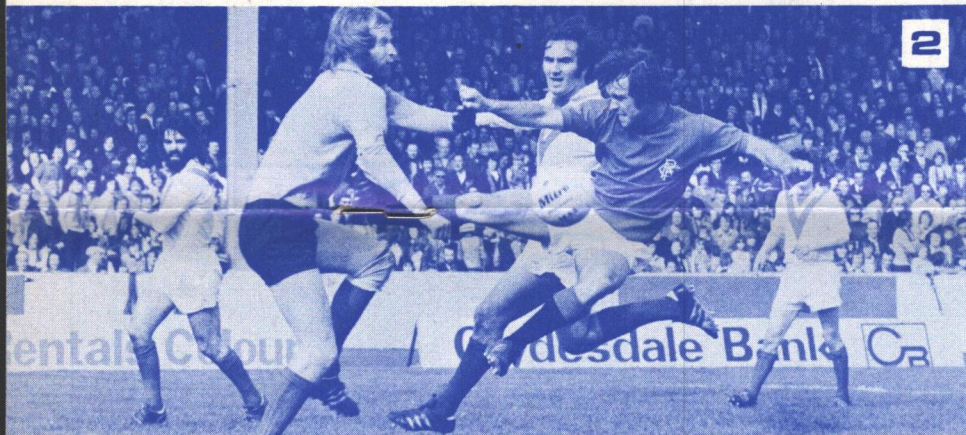

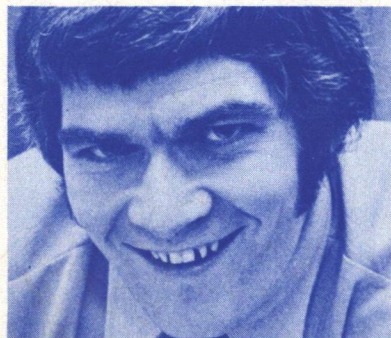
THE PROBLEMS of part-time football have never been brought home more forcibly to Airdrie than in their preparations for the new season . . . particularly in view of the tough League Cup section start which brings them to Ibrox today.

Because of staggered holidays etc., the full Broomfield squad have not been together during the pre-season training except for a few days during this week.

And with only a warm-up game against Queen's Park behind them, Airdrie could understandably be excused lack of sharpness today.

"With the season starting a week earlier than it has in recent years, we certainly haven't had as much time together," says skipper Derek Whiteford.

"But I don't think that will matter too much considering the atmosphere and tension we can expect at Ibrox in the first game of the season. That will

help lift us. Besides, I always feel we play better on the big occasions and when things are against us".

Schoolteacher Derek is the perfect example of the kind of spirit Rangers can expect to meet today—he was hospitalised for a few days during the close season for a toe operation, then out of action for six weeks.

But once he got back into action, he skipped any real holidays and trained throughout the remainder of the summer. Airdrie will fight, that's for sure.

And with two victories over Rangers last season—the only club to pull off a League double over the Light Blues during their championship run—Airdrie have a right to a certain amount of confidence. "Ibrox will bring out the best in us", says skipper Whiteford.

## IT'S A FACT

RANGERS and Airdrie have been drawn together in the League Cup only three times previously—in section ties in 1961-62 and 69-70 and in the quarter-finals in 1965-66.

The full record reads: 1961-62—Rangers 4 Airdrie 1, Airdrie 1 Rangers 2. 1965-66—Airdrie 1 Rangers 5, Rangers 4 Airdrie 0. 1969-70—Airdrie 0 Rangers 3, Rangers 3 Airdrie 0.

Rangers, as you can see, have won all six meetings—scoring 20 goals and conceding only three in the process.

In the 65-66 quarter-final meetings, Jim Forrest and George McLean were the men who dumped Airdrie. McLean hit two goals in the first leg at Broomfield with Forrest getting one. In the return, Forrest banged in a hat-trick and McLean got the other goal.

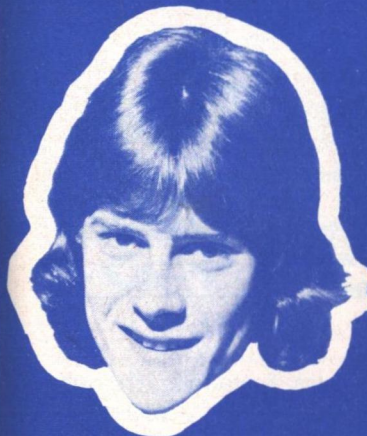

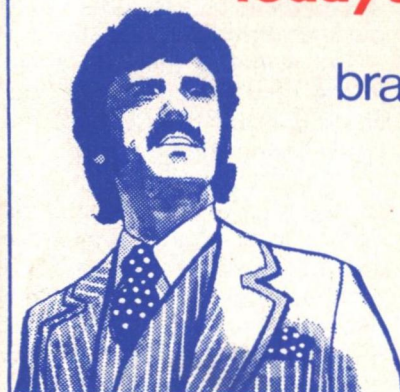

# MASON SETS HIS TARGETS

**MORE trophies—and more youngsters breaking through to the first team. These are coach Joe Mason's objectives as the Reserves get geared for the start of their season at Broomfield today in the Reserve League Cup.**

And coach Mason makes it clear which is the more important of his aims:

"My main job is to bring through boys who can step into the first team," says Joe.

"There are several who have been knocking on the door and this year is their chance to bang even harder.

"I'm looking for a lot from Ally Dawson, Martin Henderson, Davie Armour and Gordon Boyd, who all had a good season last year and with that experience behind them can step up their effort now."

Of course, Joe also intends that the Colts should pick up a share of the trophies again this term.

They are, of course, holders of the Reserve League title and Second Eleven Cup.

"We've missed the Reserve League Cup by a narrow margin quite a few times in recent seasons. We haven't won it since 1967-68, so I'd like to put that right," says Joe.

But winning the title again in the new set-up will be just as difficult for the Colts as the battle facing the first team.

"We'll have more tough visits to places like Pittodrie, Dens Park, Easter Road, Tynecastle and Parkhead," says Joe. "But then, they've all got to come here twice as well.

"We can only get out and do our best to win every game."

## PLAY IT SAFE

RANGERS FOOTBALL CLUB ask all fans to co-operate and make sure that everyone leaves the ground with the maximum of comfort and safety by following this procedure at the end of the game:

1. Take your time leaving the Stadium.
2. If you see that passages or stairways are becoming jammed—hold back. You will only be delayed for a few moments.
3. Help any youngster, old person—anyone in fact—if you think they are having difficulty.
4. Be particularly careful on the exit stairs, and avoid jostling as much as possible.
5. Abide by Stewards' and Police instructions.

## REMEMBER THE CODE—BEHAVE

RANGERS Football Club, in this new season, once again remind all fans of their duty to uphold the good name of the club. Ibrox is a trouble-free ground, and the club thanks the supporters for their splendid encouragement and behaviour. Rangers would like to see this standard of conduct carried forward to away matches as well. And by following the Ibrox code of conduct printed below, the supporters can help tremendously towards a trouble-free day.

1. Ban the carrying of alcohol on buses.
2. Ban members from taking alcohol into the stadium.
3. Ban the singing of provocative songs in buses and on the terracings.
4. Ban the use of obscene language.
5. Have the greatest respect for residents in the vicinity of football grounds. Do not be a public nuisance.
6. Put an end to members urinating at the roadside when travelling.
7. Set a good example to the youngsters who are travelling.
8. Impress on youth the importance of good behaviour.
9. Have respect for women who attend matches.
10. Notify Ibrox Stadium of any sign of hooliganism both home and away, giving report and details.

The Club, Police, Local Authorities and S.F.A. will back the supporters association in these measures.
