beat. Any team that can go through a 26-match League programme and lose only a dozen goals is clearly going to be a problem.

"We'll have to find a way past a very tough defence."

Manager Wallace, like the majority of the Ibrox staff, is a newcomer to the premier European competition—although of course he has had plenty of experience of the Cup Winners' Cup and U.E.F.A. Cup.

"But this is the big one. It's the icing on the cake for us. We want to make a good run at it—and we'll have to start off by producing the right form tonight," he says.

Jock, and his players, are aiming to get a good enough lead tonight to go to Dublin in two weeks time with the tie all but settled.

"It's the first European Cup tie at Ibrox for 10 years—I'd like to make it a spectacular return to the big one," says Jock.

"IT won't be easy." That's the message Rangers' manager Jock Wallace conveyed to his players after watching Bohemians in action a couple of weeks ago when the Irish side lost narrowly to Scottish cracks Hibs in a friendly in Dublin.

"Bohemians looked very well organised," says Jock. "It will be a tougher game than many people think.

"Hibs were further advanced in their preparations than Bohemians, but had to fight for that win.

"And the defensive record of the Irish side makes it clear just how difficult they will be to

# A warning for the Light Blues

**BOHEMIANS**, despite being founded in 1890, last season won the League of Ireland Championship for the first time since the war ... only five years after turning professional.

For until 1970 Bohemians were strictly amateur. The transition to professional football was quickly made—indeed last season they won four of the five competitions open to them.

Which is fair enough warning to Rangers that they will be dealing with a very solid, well-organised team tonight.

Bohemians' championship win was their sixth in the club's history, and they have also won the Cup four times.

Their title victory was a strange one to say the least. They lost only two matches out of 26 League games played and won by a margin of nine points.

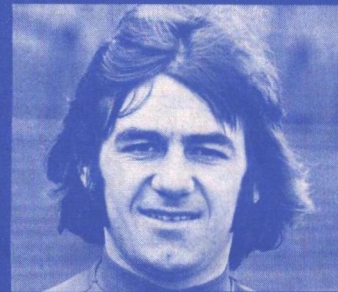
Yet in the process they scored only 36 goals!

What got them the flag was a resoundingly strong defence ... one that conceded only 12 goals in 26 games. And that, surely, is another warning to Rangers tonight—goals could be hard to get against such a well-drilled outfit.

However, in Europe the Irish side have failed to make an impact. This is their fourth European tournament tilt since 1970 and so far they have still to win a match and have gone out each time in the first round.

Again, however, the Irish club feel that the team has been improving all the time, learning from the European experience, and Rangers manager Jock

Wallace was impressed by their recent showing when he watched them go down to one of Scotland's top teams Hibs 1-0—despite having been in training for only a week.

Rangers have met Irish clubs twice before in European competition—and came through well.

In the first round of the 1966-67 Cup Winners' Cup they beat Glentoran 5-1 on aggregate (drawing 1-1 in the first leg away) then in 1968-69 in the second round of the Fairs Cup they thrashed Dundalk 6-1 at Ibrox in the first leg and won the return match 3-0 in Ireland.

The Light Blues are looking for an Irish hat-trick this time.

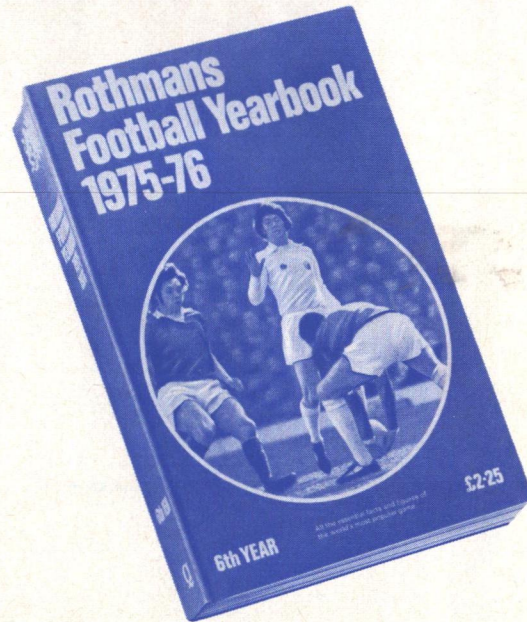

## European 88th for Rangers

RANGERS launch into a European tie for the 88th time tonight, in a long and distinguished record which goes back nearly 20 years.

The first-ever European game for the club came on October 24, 1956 when French side Nice came to Ibrox. It was a winning start, too, for Rangers—with goals from Billy Simpson and Max Murray giving the Light Blues a 2-1 win. That very first European line-up was: Niven; Shearer, Caldwell; McColl, Young, Logie; Scott, Simpson, Murray, Baird, Hubbard.

The return game went to Nice by the same margin and in a Paris play-off Rangers went down 2-1. That was the first of many disappointments in Europe.

But, of course, there have been the moments of triumph—particularly in Barcelona on May 24, 1972 when Rangers beat Moscow Dynamo 3-2 in the Final to win the European Cup Winners' Cup.

Twice before the Ibrox men had reached the Final of this tournament—in the opening year of the competition when they lost 4-1 on aggregate over two legs against Italian side Fiorentina, then in Nuremberg

in 1966-67 German super side Bayern dumped Rangers with an extra-time goal to win 1-0.

In the European Cup, Rangers reached the semi-finals once (losing to Eintracht in 1959-60) and the quarter-finals in 61-62 when they went out to Standard Liege and of course in 64-65 when Inter Milan got through 3-2 on aggregate.

Rangers' full record in 87 ties reads:

Rangers have played 31 European Cup ties, winning 18, drawing 1 and losing 12. In the process they have scored 59 goals and lost 64.

# GREIG'S GREAT EUROPE RECORD

**EUROPEAN tie no. 55—** that's the record for Rangers skipper John Greig against Bohemians tonight (barring injury of course).

Skipper Greig began his European career back in season 1961-62 in the European Cup—and it was hardly an inspiring beginning. He was in the side that lost 4-1 away to Standard Liege in Belgium in the first leg of the quarter-final.

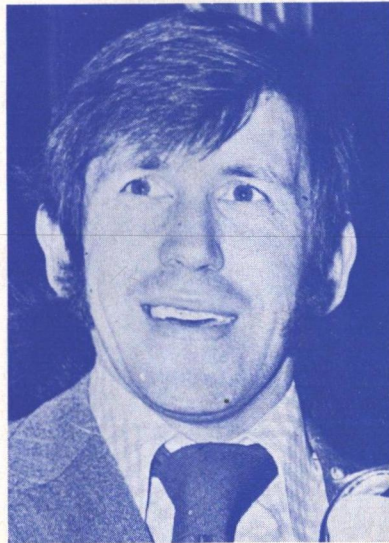
John didn't play in the return match, which Rangers won 2-0 but, of course, meant they still had failed to carry through.

That was when John was just starting to make the break-through as a regular.

By 1963-64 he was a fixture in the side and played in the two games against Real Madrid which the Spanish magicians won in the first round.

Then in 1964-65 John turned out in all seven games played that season in the competition when Rangers beat Red Star Belgrade (after a play-off at High-bury), Vienna Rapid then lost out to Inter-Milan in the quarter-finals.

In all, John has played in 10 European Cup ties—tonight his 11th and he's hoping for his dozen in the return.



His European Cup Winner's Cup tally is 27 and he has battled through 17 Fairs Cup ties.

Says John: "I'm really looking forward to getting back into European action again. There's no doubt there is something special about the atmosphere of these games.

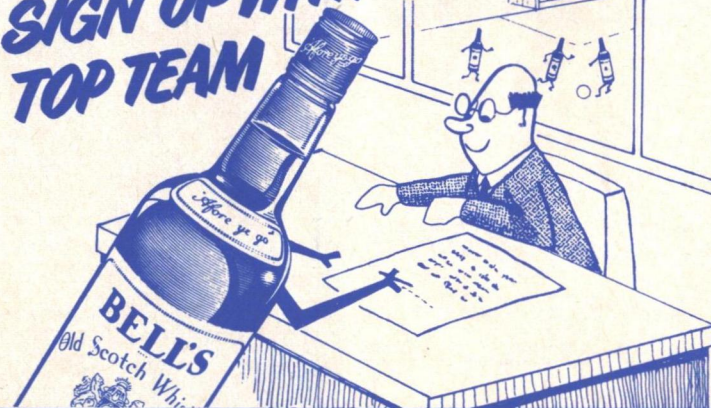

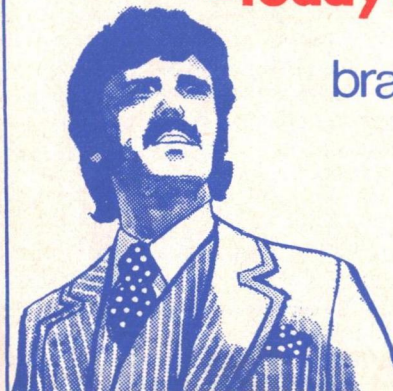

# 'Title chase tougher than ever'—Mason

**RANGERS**, Reserve League champions for the past two seasons, are going to have to play better than ever to retain the championship this term.

That's the opinion of Rangers coach Joe Mason.

Says Joe: "Because of the set-up in the new Premier Reserve League, the odds are against Rangers more this season. We will have only one home game against Celtic, Hibs and Aberdeen and will have to play them twice away from home.

"This will obviously make it a lot tougher for us to win the title. But it certainly gives the players an incentive to do well every week. We simply cannot afford to slacken off".

The unbalanced fixtures in the Reserve League have come about because the Scottish League have, for the moment, decided that the Reserve Championship will finish on March 6, with the teams having played only 27 games instead of the 36 scheduled for the Premier Division Championship. What it means is that the Reserves will fulfil the same fixtures as the first team up until March 6 (they will be away of course when the first team are due at home).

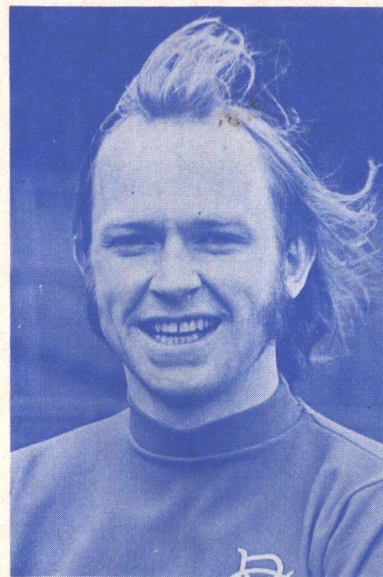
This unfortunately for the Colts means that by missing the last "quarter" of the fixtures from March 6 to April 24, they lose home matches against Celtic, St. Johnstone, Hibs, Aberdeen and Dundee United... all of whom the Reserves will have played twice away from home.

"It's just unfortunate the way the fixtures worked out for us" says coach Mason. "We'll just have to play twice as well to make up for it".

However, there is a chance that if the Reserve Championship is bang up to date when it is due to finish on March 6 that the Scottish League could decide to extend it to take in the remaining nine fixtures due to be played in the Premier Division.

Failing that, there could be an additional Cup competition fitted in at the end of the Reserve Championship.

Mind you, in recent years the Reserve title chase has been badly

disrupted by postponed fixtures to such an extent that teams have finished up with three and four games a week to try to catch up in the final stages of the championship.

So it could be that by March 6 there will be enough games outstanding to take the Reserve Championship on into April.

For a start, Rangers have already fallen one match behind—their game against St. Johnstone on Saturday at Perth was put off because the Muirton side had been badly hit by illness and couldn't raise a team.

So that's one behind for a start, and if the weather turns nasty over the next few months then the "breathing space" at the end of the shorter championship might very well be needed to help clear up any back-log.

## PLAY IT SAFE

RANGERS FOOTBALL CLUB ask all fans to co-operate and make sure that everyone leaves the ground with the maximum of comfort and safety by following this procedure at the end of the game:

1. Take your time leaving the Stadium.
2. If you see that passages or stairways are becoming jammed—hold back. You will only be delayed for a few moments.
3. Help any youngster, old person—anyone in fact—if you think they are having difficulty.
4. Be particularly careful on the exit stairs, and avoid jostling as much as possible.
5. Abide by Stewards' and Police instructions.
