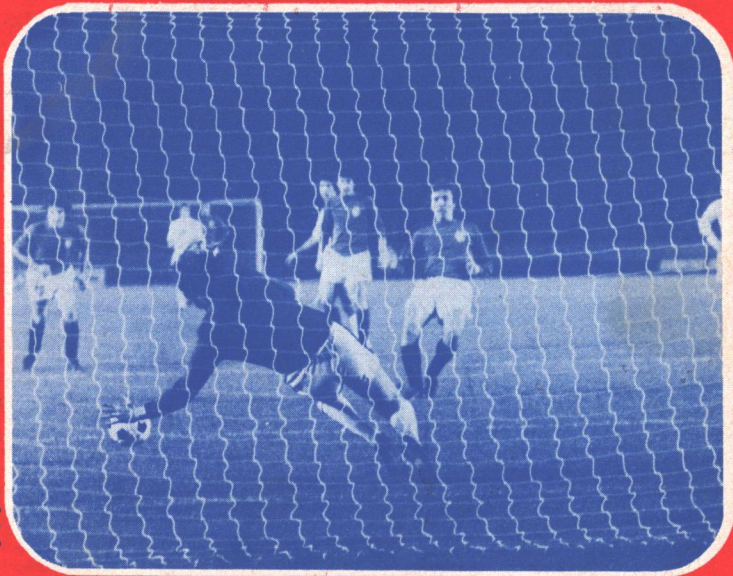

## ***Bankies won't go down*** **Spotlight on CLYDEBANK**

**PREMIER FOOTBALL has been a struggle for Clydebank—and they are doomed for a quick return to the First Division.**

They have managed only three wins in 20 starts so far, and are still looking for a victory away from home.

Hardly encouraging. However, Bankies are determined to go out of the Premier League in fighting fashion and hope to spring a few shocks between now and April.

The step-up to Premier soccer came just too soon for Bankies, who are still in the process of building a team.

And, of course, the loss, first of all of Davie Cooper to Rangers in a £100,000 transfer deal, and then a few months ago the departure of Mike Larnach to Newcastle in a similar move, has deprived Bankies of much of the attacking power that made them so effective in the First Division last season.

However, Bankies believe that they will gain one thing from their short stay at the top—vital experience—particularly for their younger players.

And when the time comes in the future for the ambitious Kilbowie club to step back up again, they hope

this experience will ensure that their stay is both much longer and a lot happier.

Bankies have a nucleus of full-time players and will probably remain full-time for a while yet to give the gamble a real chance.

Goalkeeper Jim Gallagher, the injured Gerry McLaughlin, John McCormick, Billy McColl, Dave Houston and Jim Lumsden are all full-timers.

Youngster Gavin Murray has just been given his place in the first team as striker to replace the departed Mike Larnach, and looks to have a good future.

Two of this season's signings are Sandy McNaughton and Gerry Colgan, both from Queens Park. Like colleague Gregor Abel, a former Falkirk player, they work as schoolteachers.

Long-service man at Kilbowie is defender Jim Fallon, who joined Bankies in 1967 when he left school. A former Youth cap, Jim is a physiotherapist.

Bankies believe that the experience of players like Jim Lumsden, Jim Fallon, Billy McColl and Joe McCallan will be vital in helping to bring on the youngsters like Murray, Houston, McCormick and McLaughlin.

And they also believe that Bankies will be back in the near future—and better prepared.

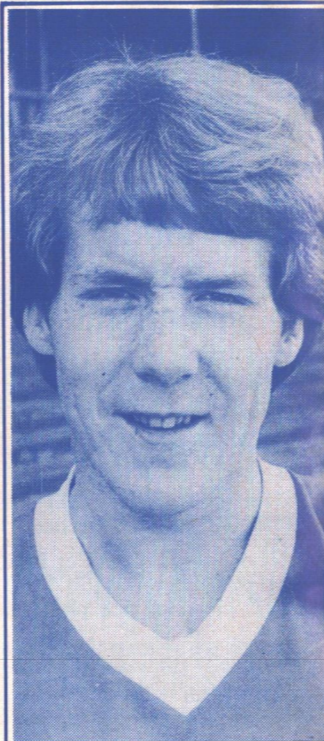

### No.17 Chris Robertson

CHRIS ROBERTSON just turned 20, has been a prolific scorer with Rangers Reserves for the past three seasons—hitting 21 goals in 27 games in 75-76; netting 25 in 29 games in 76-77 and having rattled in 22 goals in 20 matches this season.

"The big problem is translating this ability into my play when I'm in the first team," says Chris. "I've not been able to do that so far, although I do believe I learned a lot from the eight full and seven substitute appearances I made last season.

"I only scored two goals in that time, mind you, so I know I've got to do better and I'm sure I can when I get another chance.

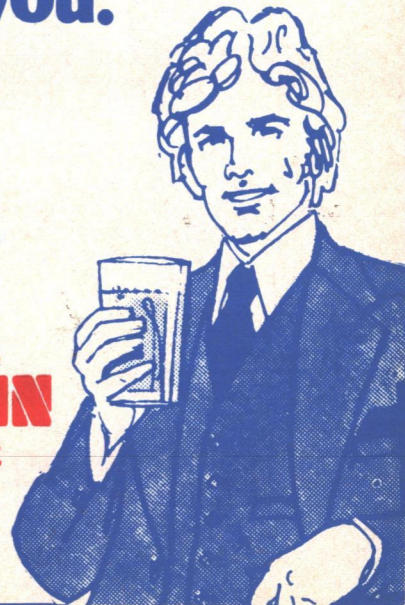
"The pace is quicker in the first team, so my reactions will have to be quicker. And you need a bit of luck, which I haven't had so far."

CLYDEBANK know all about Davie Cooper's ability—they had him on their side for long enough.

But when they visited Ibrox on October 1 for the only Premier League match played between the clubs so far, they found out what opponents had been suffering all that time.

For it was Cooper who clobbered his former Kilbowie colleagues.

Mind you, it wasn't until the second half that it all began to happen for Rangers and

Cooper. In the first half, with Bankies having the advantage of a fierce icy wind blowing them on, the Kilbowie boys took the lead through a deflected Gerry Colgan shot in the 21st minute and might have had a couple more.

But once Rangers came out after the interval to play with the wind behind them, it was all over for Bankies.

Cooper banged in the equaliser in 53 minutes after robbing Billy McColl.

Then in the 67th minute Cooper flighted in a perfect free kick which Gordon Smith headed home.

That seemed to be the end of the scoring—until Cooper stepped in three minutes from time with a goal straight from a corner kick on the right.

And that inspired Gordon Smith to complete a double himself (and the scoring) when he wriggled through the defence in the last minute to smack home a great goal.

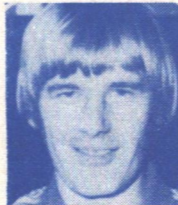
1. Take your time leaving the Stadium.

# Joe has that deadly touch

**JOE McCALLAN was the less publicised half of the deadly scoring partnership that shot Clydebank into the Premier Division two seasons ago.**

He and Mike Larnach hit 59 goals between them in season 76-77—with Joe banging in 31 of the goals in his own quietly efficient fashion.

Larnach has, of course, since been transferred and that leaves the 5ft 8in, ex-Alloa man Joe to carry the scoring load.

Like the rest of the Bankies side he hasn't found it easy to get goals in the Premier Division, and has hit only five to date.

But Joe proved in the past that he has the scoring touch—and players with that kind of ability are always dangerous.

5. Have the greatest respect for residents in the vicinity of football grounds. Do not be a public nuisance.

6. Put an end to members urinating at the roadside when travelling.

7. Set a good example to the youngsters who are travelling.

8. Impress on youth the importance of good behaviour.

9. Have respect for women who attend matches.

10. Notify Ibrox Stadium of any sign of hooliganism both home and away.

The Club, Police, Local Authorities and S.F.A. will back the supporters' association in these measures.

# Reserve Review



## Cup draw is just dandy for Colts

RANGERS Reserves have been paired against Dundee United in the Second Eleven Cup quarter-finals, and will play the tie at Ibrox on Saturday, February 11.

If the Colts win through, they will face either Celtic or Kilmarnock in the semi-final... again at Ibrox.

In the League, the Colts are still well out in front with a lead of 10 points over nearest challengers Aberdeen, who have three games in hand.

This is quite encouraging, but coach Joe Mason will be looking for a better performance from his men than they gave in their last outing—which was against Ayr United at Somerset.

For the Colts struggled to a

2-2 draw, and it took two goals from substitute Derek Strickland to land the vital point. Indeed, his double came in the last seven minutes. Derek, who was sent on for defender Alan Boyd, got his first in the 83rd minute when a long goal-kick from keeper Peter McCloy caught the Ayr defence open and young Derek raced in to score from 10 yards.

Then with the game in the final seconds, Derek moved on to a headed pass from Derek Parlane and fired in the equaliser from close range.

"I'm hoping we can get settled down to form again over the next few games" says coach Joe Mason.

"At the moment we seem to be swinging back and forwards in the form graph. I'd like to

get back to a consistent pattern".

An illustration of what coach Mason means can be seen from the fact that in the past six games the Reserves have scored a 6-0 win, two 5-1 victories, a 3-0 success over Celtic... but lost to Hibs and drawn with Ayr.

The team that drew at Somerset was: McCloy; A. Boyd, Dawson; Hamilton, Denny, Morris; McLean, Brand, Parlane, Watson, McKean.

Derek Strickland came on as substitute for Alan Boyd and Davie Armour replaced Ralph Brand.
