**MANAGER JOCK WALLACE** maintained all along, even when Rangers had what looked like a comfortable 'cushion' of points, that this season's Premier title battle would go to the last game.

He also warned that Rangers would have to WIN the flag—they wouldn't be presented with it.

The defeat by Celtic at Parkhead was, of course, a disappointment. And there is no doubt that in recent weeks the team has gone 'off the boil' a bit because of the loss of form of some players.

But if there is one thing Rangers are never afraid of,

that's a challenge. It's going to be a hard fight to win the title, so Rangers will just have to get down to the job in traditional style.

Every match will be vital—and that means half-a-dozen crackers between now and the end of the month.

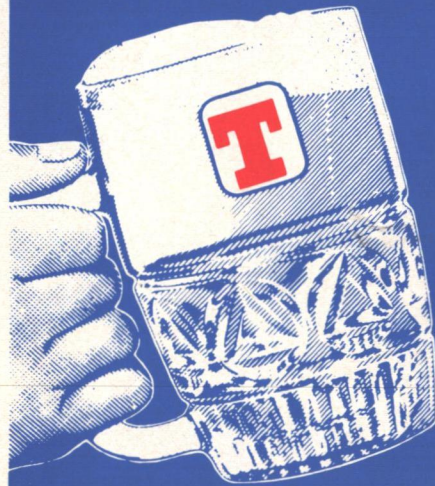

## Now Saints know Top Ten

**ST. MIRREN** have, rightly, been acclaimed as one of the most exciting young sides in the Premier Division—a team full of bright youngsters and attacking ideas.

But this abundance of ability hasn't stopped Saints finding out that life in the Premier Division is very hard.

It's consistency that counts, and Saints have discovered like most teams that this is an elusive quality.

After an early season "flier" which saw them sitting high in the League, Saints then hit a slump, recovered, fell back again but are now coming with a strong late run which should ensure them of Premier survival... which is probably what manager Alex Ferguson would have settled for 'way back at the start of the season.

After all, Saints are first-year Premier candidates and most teams coming up from the First Division have had to settle for a policy of consolidation in the first year then started to look for bigger and better things after that.

Which is the way it could be for Saints, providing they are able to hang on to the fine young players they currently have on the staff.

Goalkeeper Alan McCulloch is the latest addition to the Paisley staff—joining them on loan from Kilmarnock a few weeks ago.

The big keeper—6 ft 2½ in and 13½ st—has been kept waiting for a chance in first team football because of the form of Killie's World Cup keeper Jim Stewart, but now he's determined to prove he is top-team quality at Paisley and is looking for a permanent move.

The Paisley rear-guard comprises full back Alex Beckett, a speedy defender with attacking flair, big twin pivots Jackie Copland and Bobby Reid—both topping 6 ft—and former Rangers and Hibs man Iain Munro who was transferred from Ibrox back to his first Senior club Saints a few months ago and has settled in at Love Street well again.

Skipper of the Saints side is Under-21 cap Tony Fitzpatrick, a hard-driving, non-stop worker with a skilful touch in midfield. Backing him are another ex-Ranger in big Billy Stark, former Arthurlie junior Lex Richardson, the spirited Billy Abercrombie and hard-working Derek Hyslop.

Up front, Saints now have the experience of the powerful Jimmy Bone to help their young forwards. Bone, ex-Partick Thistle, Sheffield United, Celtic and Arbroath is a strong, bustling player who can hold the ball and distribute it to his colleagues despite the tackling of defenders.

Saints have relied a lot for goals this season on Under-21 cap Frank McGarvey, the club's leading marksman with 19 goals. Next best is midfield man Stark on 9... alongside a man who has to be watched carefully at corner kicks... 6 ft 3 in centre half Bobby Reid.

Saints also have standing by teenagers like Andy Dunlop, Robert Torrance and Phil McAveety.

## FACTS & FIGURES

RANGERS' record in the Scottish Cup dates back to 1874-75 and contains a study in statistics which makes incredible reading.

Wednesday's semi-final against Dundee United at Hampden will be the club's 419th Scottish Cup tie.

It will also be the 44th time the club has appeared in a semi-final.

Rangers have won the trophy 21 times in 31 Final appearances (including 1908-09 when the trophy was withheld after Rangers and Celtic had drawn 2-2 and 1-1).

Rangers have now scored a total of 1,157 Scottish Cup goals and conceded 407.

Of the 418 ties played, Rangers have won 282, drawn 66 and lost 70.

Today's Premier meeting with St. Mirren is the 148th League clash between the clubs... but only the fourth Premier encounter.

In the previous 147 games, Rangers have been victorious 100 times, Saints have won 16 times and there have been 31 drawn matches.

RANGERS face Dundee United in the semi-final of the Scottish Cup at Hampden on Wednesday night—and they go into the meeting with the knowledge that they have never lost a Scottish tie against the Tannadice side.

Mind you—there haven't been many Cup clashes between the clubs. Wednesday's encounter is, in fact, only the fifth time they have been drawn together.

The other four games have all gone to Rangers. The facts and figures are:

Three times after victories over United Rangers have gone on to the Scottish Cup Final... and won twice.

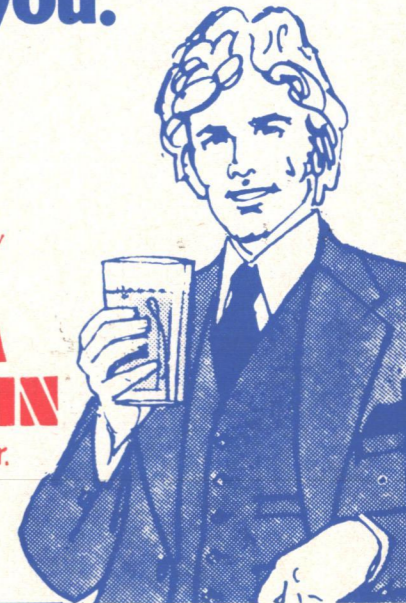
In 1928-29 Rangers, the holders, were beaten 2-0 by Kilmarnock in a shock result at Hampden.

But in 1962-63, after the semi win over United Rangers beat Celtic 3-0 in a replay after a 1-1 draw and in 1972-73 again beat Celtic in the Final after the third round win over United.

In 1964-65, the Light Blues were beaten in the third round by Hibs following the second round win over United.

RANGERS hold the edge  
in games against Saints  
this season . . . having won  
two with the other match  
drawn.

That draw, at Love  
Street on September 17,  
was a cracking affair  
which finished up 3-3.  
Rangers were twice  
ahead . . . and once down  
in a match that see-sawed  
back and forward.

Sandy Jardine put the  
Light Blues ahead in the  
27th minute with a clever  
left foot shot. But then  
Saints hit back with goals  
from Docherty in 33  
minutes and McGarvey  
from the penalty spot in  
43 after a disputed award  
for a Jackson tackle on  
Hyslop.

Two minutes after the  
break, Rangers sweeper  
Tom Forsyth was ordered  
off but despite this the  
Ibrox men banged in two  
quick goals to take the  
lead . . . with Cooper and  
Johnstone the marksmen.

Finally the whole frantic  
affair was rounded off by  
a McGarvey equaliser in  
the 67th minute.

When the clubs met at  
Ibrox on November 19,  
there was again a load of  
controversy caused by the  
first half ordering off of  
Rangers' Tommy McLean  
and St. Mirren's Bobby  
Reid. The goals in this  
game came in the second  
half, with Johnstone  
heading Rangers into the  
lead, Stark equalising then  
Miller slotting the winner  
from the penalty spot.

At Love Street on  
January 14, Rangers got  
through 2-0 with goals  
from Johnstone (21 mins.)  
and Smith (73 mins.) but  
owed a lot to the fine work  
of keeper Stewart  
Kennedy . . . and a bit of  
luck, for Saints hit the  
woodwork three times.

The games have all been  
fast and furious, which  
augurs well for today.

**FRANK McGARVEY'S** point-winning goal against Motherwell at Paisley last week was his 19th goal of the season for St. Mirren—a tally which confirms the energetic young striker as one of the best prospects in the country.

And it leaves him just one short of his total for Saints for last season—a target he is certain to pass in his current form.

Frank has scored more than double any other Saints player this season—and considering it is his first year in Premier football, that says a lot.

He's not big at 5 ft 9 in. And he's a slim 10 st 7 lbs. But courage, pace and skill make up all the difference and lift him into the top bracket.

Frank, a joiner to trade, has won recognition at Under-21 level. He is in the Scotland World Cup 40 for the Argentine, and while he is not likely to make the final 22 is obviously well in the running for a place in the future.

It's no wonder he is watched and wanted by big clubs in Scotland and England.

Derek has banged in 15 goals in 29 full and two substitute appearances for the Light Blues in the Cup.

Next comes wee Alex MacDonald with 12 from 34 full and two substitute appearances and then on 10 is Tommy McLean (30 appearances) followed on the 8 mark by skipper John Greig (70 ties) and Derek Parlane (16 full and three subs).

This season, Derek Johnstone has scored four Scottish Cup goals, Colin Jackson two and one apiece for Alex MacDonald, Davie Cooper and Johnny Hamilton.

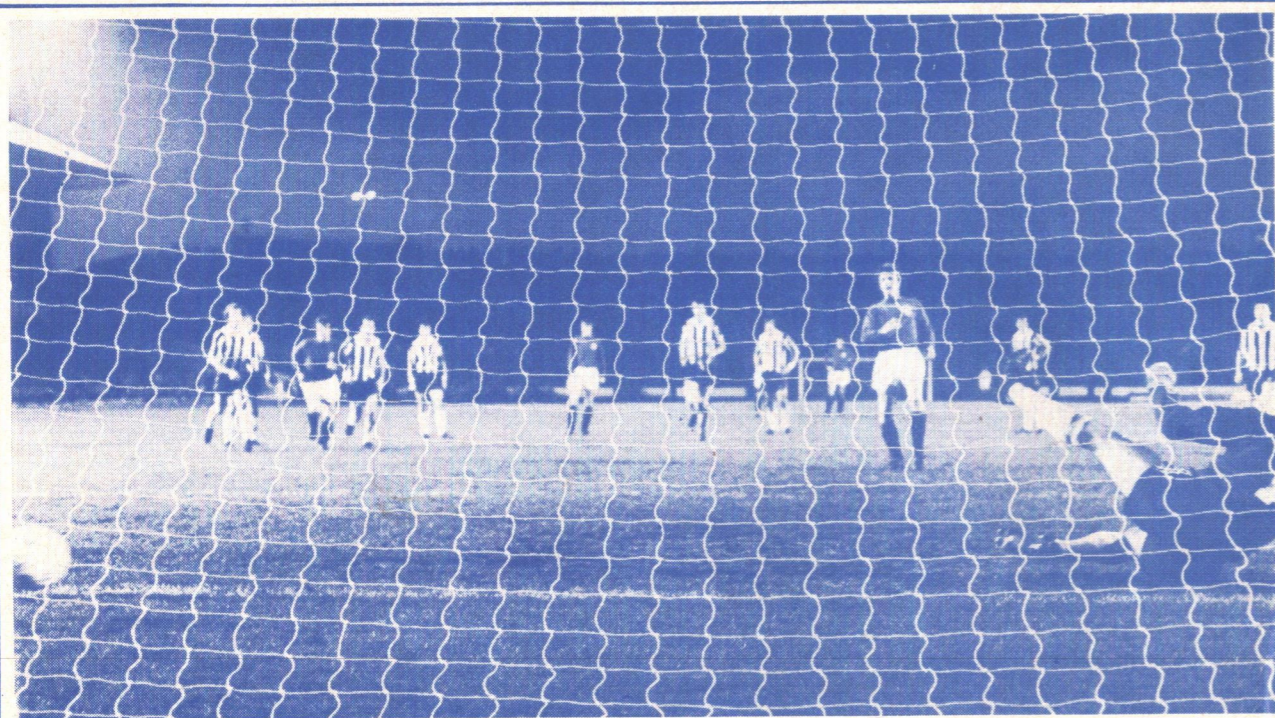

# Reserve Review



## Set back... but still sitting pretty!

RANGERS Reserves had a slight set-back in their title-winning plans when they lost 2-1 to Partick Thistle at Firhill last week.

But with virtually still a 10-point lead over nearest rivals Aberdeen—even taking in the fact Dons have a couple of games in hand—Rangers are still comfortably placed for yet another championship win.

It may mean delaying the flag celebrations for a week or so, but the defeat at Firhill has not depressed coach Joe Mason—which is natural since it was only the team's fourth League defeat of the season.

"We didn't play well in the first half—yet finished up leading by a goal at the interval," says Joe.

"Then we went out after the break and played a whole lot better, and lost two goals. But that's football.

"Overall I was disappointed by the result, but not by the performance."

Kenny Watson put the Colts ahead in the first half, but then after the break Jags came back to score twice to take the points, with Rangers missing a lot of chances in that second period.

The team was: McCloy; A. Boyd, Dawson; Russell, Denny, Morris; McKay, Watson, Robertson, Armour, Strickland.

Martin Henderson came on as substitute for McKay during the match.

The Colts were due to play Hibs at Ibrox on Wednesday night in a League match, and were hoping for a result that would take them another step towards the title for the fifth year in a row.

Full details will be given in next week's Rangers News.

At the time of going to press, no dates had been settled for the Reserves looming Second XI and Reserve League Cup ties.
